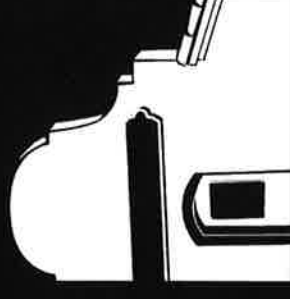
#### **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA):**

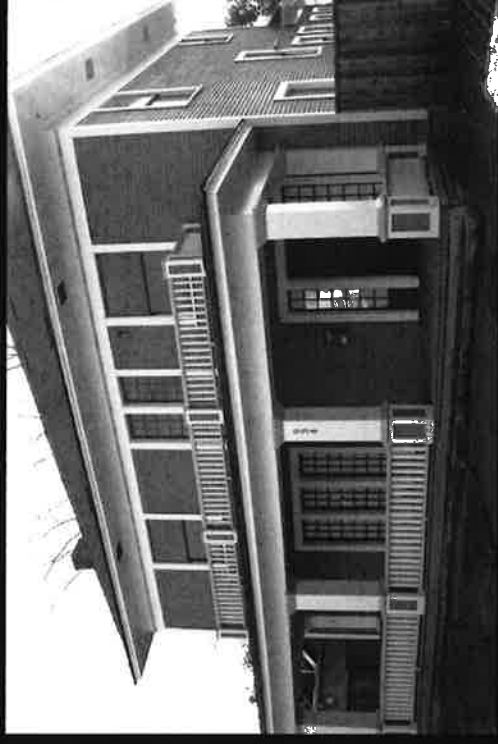
# 2016 Historic Preservation Awards

- *Mayor's Historic Preservation Awards Initiated in 2005-*
- *Awards honor individuals and community groups who have demonstrated excellence in the restoration of a historic building, leadership in preservation planning or neighborhood revitalization-*
- *12 separate awards this year; 4 projects located in the Downtown Triangle.*



# Outstanding Rehabilitation of a Residential Property

- *Stephen Walter for the restoration of the circa 1904 American Foursquare style home-*
- *Located at 934 E. Mildreda in the Lowell Neighborhood-*
- *Now Historic Property #301.*



# Outstanding Rehabilitation of a Residential Property



- *AFREI LLC-*
- *For the rehabilitation of the c1902 Neo-classical cottage located at 1320 P Street -*
- *The home was boarded and abandoned but was found eligible for listing on the California Register of Historical Resources in the City's Fulton Corridor Historic Survey.*



# Outstanding Rehabilitation of a Non-Residential Building

- *Reza Assemi for the restoration and adaptive reuse of The PGE Building (aka Theatre 3), located at 1544 Fulton Street-*
- *HP# 164 (1926)*
- *Now houses a public relations firm.*



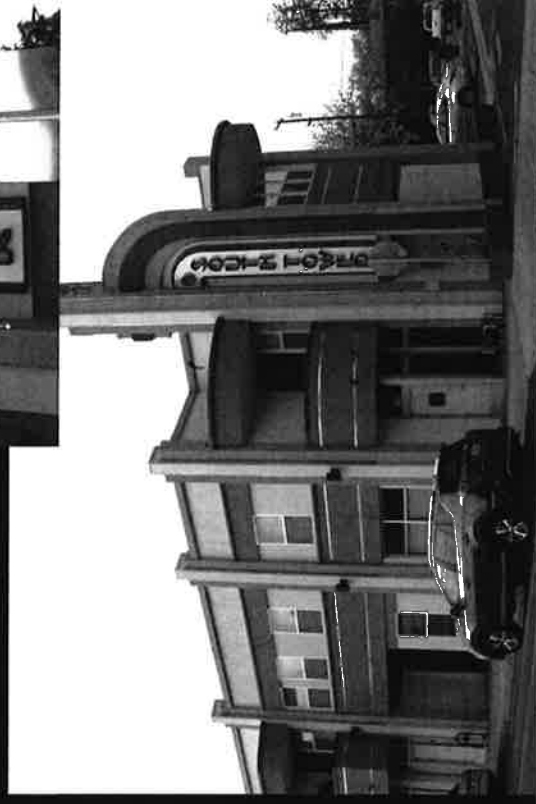
# Adaptive Reuse of a Historic Property

- *Jake Soberal, Will Dyck and Henderson Architectural Group-*
- *For the rehabilitation and adaptive reuse of the 1914 Phelan Building (HP#159), 700 Van Ness-*
- *Abandoned former car dealership was restored and repurposed as Bitwise South Stadium.*



# Best In-Fill Project

- *Award for a new project designed to fit with the historic context of an older neighborhood-*
- *Art Deco retro look of 541 at South Tower-*
- *Terance Frazier, Marvin Armstrong (architect), Kiel Schmidt (neon design) and Fresno Housing Authority.*





# Community Awards

- *The Mayor's Historic Preservation Awards also honor individuals and groups for their contributions to history, architectural research and community service.*
- *Five awards this year.*

- *Stewardship of the National Register Fresno Brewing Company Building; leadership in the South Van Ness Industrial District neighborhood and support to City preservation events.*

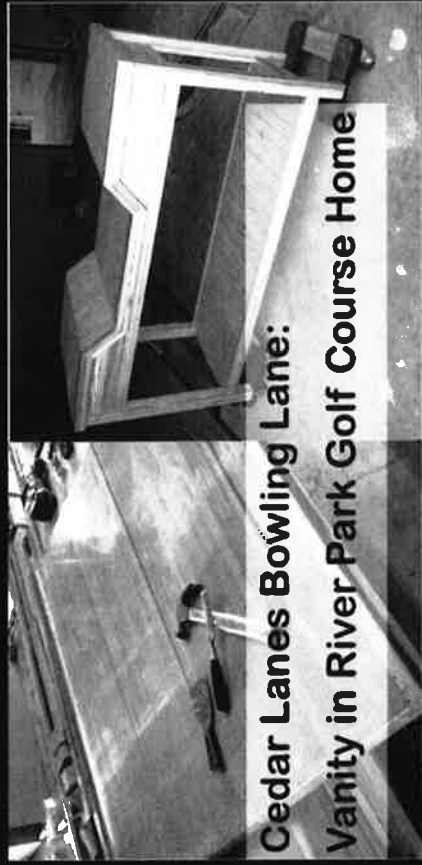


# John Walker (Fresno Bee)

- *Informative writing and photography on Fresno's history and architecture through his occasional series, "Historical Perspectives."*

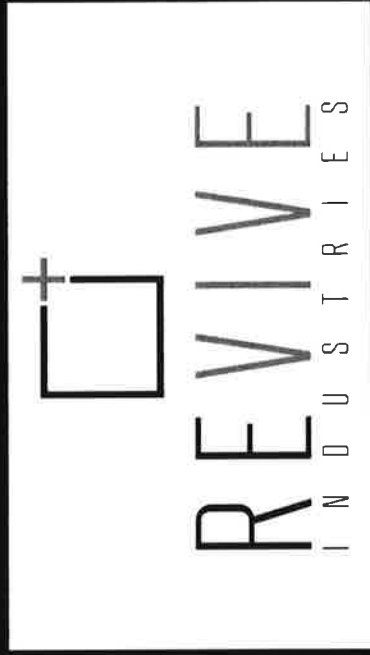
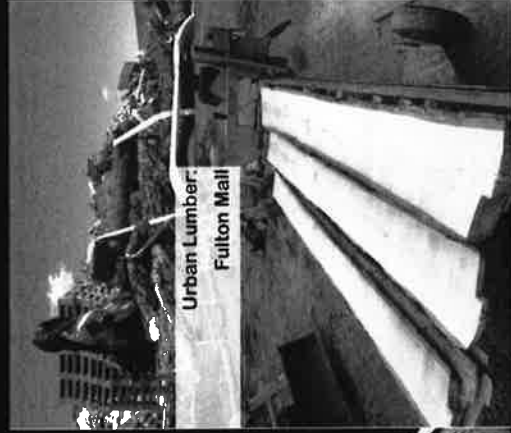

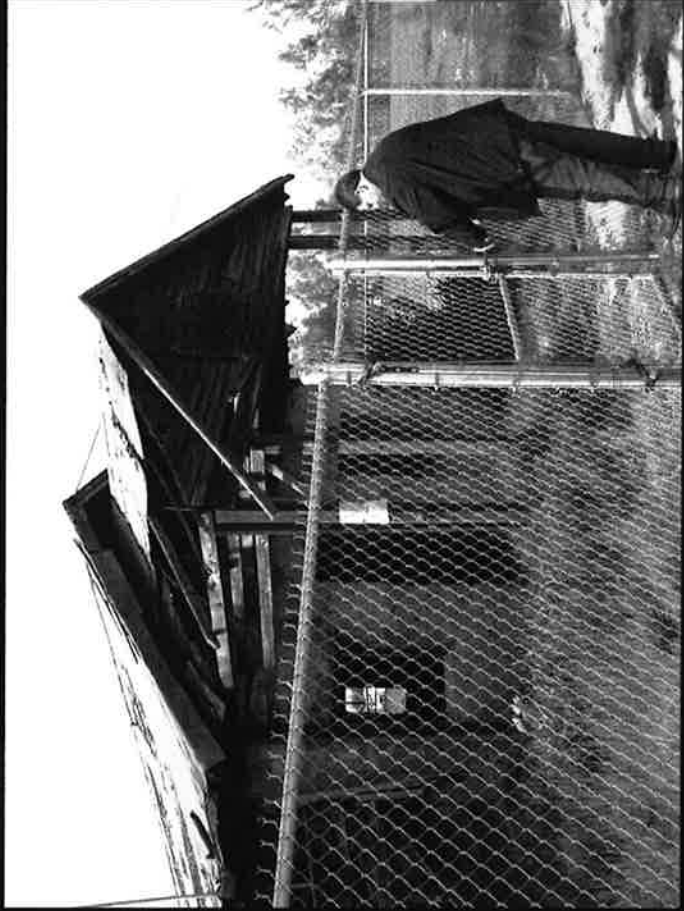
Cedar Lanes Bowling Lane:

# Horizon Award

- *The Horizon award is given to an individual or group who has made significant contributions to Fresno's history and heritage over the last few years-*
- *This year's winner, Christopher Rocha is acknowledged for his advocacy for the preservation of the Hotel Fresno and for creation of Facebook groups: "Historically Fresno" "Vintage Fresno" and "Saving Hotel Fresno".*

# Russell and Pat Fey Award

- Award named for Russ and Pat Fey (now both deceased) long time advocates of Fresno's history and architecture-
- Robert Boro is a 4<sup>th</sup> generation Fresnan whose great grandfather Herman Levy arrived in 1872 and opened a dry goods store in 1874-
- Grandfather Herbert founded Levy Brothers Insurance and Real Estate.

- *Former member of the HPC-*
- *Preserved/restored two historic homes-*
- *Major advocate for Wilson Island Historic District.*
