CITIZENS' PUBLIC SAFETY ADVISORY BOARD

✓ Board Duties

Advise the OIR on Community-Based Policing

Develop performance metrics for Community-Based Policing

Work with OIR on mediating conflicts between PD and community

Review all legally available information regarding policies, practices and procedures, subject to Peace Officers Bill of Rights

Review with OIR officer involved shootings

Review with OIR excessive force & other critical incidents

Prepare quarterly reports and recommendations to OIR and to City Manager. Manager to report to Council

CITIZENS' PUBLIC SAFETY ADVISORY BOARD

✓ Changes to the Office of Independent Review (OIR)

OIR will be a full-time, local position, including community outreach

OIR should have law enforcement experience

OIR will attend all meetings of the Citizens' Public Safety Advisory Board, provide the Board information in order for the Board to make policy and procedure recommendations. All information will be subject to POBRA

OIR will attend as many Officer-Involved Shooting investigations as possible

OIR will attend Officer-Involved Shooting Committee meetings

OIR will assist the Board in preparing quarterly reports and recommendations to be presented to the City Manager and the Council

OIR will meet monthly with the Chief of Police and also with the Fresno Police Officers Association

OIR will be where residents can present their complaints and concerns
