A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, GRANTING AUTHORITY TO THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$730,875 TO PROVIDE WRAPAROUND SERVICES FOR YOUTH JOBS CORPS MEMBERS FUNDED BY THE YOUTH JOBS CORPS GRANT

WHEREAS, in 2024, the City of Fresno (City) was awarded the Youth Jobs Corps grant from the Governor's Office through California Volunteers in the amount of \$3,014,593; and

WHEREAS, through a formal request for proposals process, four proposals were submitted through the City's Planet Bids portal by local not-for-profit organizations to provide wraparound services to members of the One Fresno Youth Jobs Corps Program.

All proposals were reviewed by committee for all proposal submission requirements; and

WHEREAS, The City Manager is now recommending two Community Based Organizations for an award of Youth Jobs Corps grant funding totaling \$730,875.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fresno as follows:

1. The Council of the City of Fresno authorizes the City Manager or his or her designee to enter into agreements in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" with the two Community Based Organizations awarded Youth Jobs Corps funding for services identified in the proposals as follows:

CASA of Fresno and Madera Counties \$138,875 - will provide wraparound services for

CASA of Fresno and Madera Counties \$138,875 – will provide wraparound services for members who are high-risk foster youth to receive assistance with case management, mentorship, recruitment, application, employment readiness, transportation, work attire, emergency shelter, education support, and life coaching.

Fresno Area Workforce Investment Corp \$600,000 – will provide wraparound services for members requesting assistance with transportation, childcare, work attire, emergency shelter, education support, and life coaching.

- 2. All agreements authorized hereunder shall be reviewed and approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office prior to execution by the City Manager or his or her designee.
- 3. Any agreement which materially deviates from the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" shall not be subject to the delegation hereby provided.
- 4. If any of the proposals set forth under Section 1 above require an environmental assessment or finding of exemption pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the City Manager or their designee shall complete the applicable review pursuant to CEQA and bring the agreement before Council for further review and adoption.
  - 5. This resolution shall be effective upon final approval.
