## **COUNCILMEMBER REPORTS AND COMMENTS**

Council President Caprioglio welcomed Councilmember-elect Mike Karbassi, District 2 to the City Council.

Councilmember Esparza thanked summer interns Charie Payne, Elizabeth Grubb and Navkaran Gurm for their help in District 7. He thanked PARCs staff for a successful "beat the heat" summer at Romain Park. He welcomed new University of California, San Francisco cohort students who will be participating in the San Joaquin program of Medical Education. With the

Fresno Barrios Unidos, he hosted a mock City Council hearing for students to participate, at City Hall in the City Council Chambers.
