WHEREAS, the City has prepared Substantial Amendment 2023-02 to the FY 2023-2024 Annual Action Plan, consistent with the five-year Consolidated Plan, which the City Council adopted on May 21, 2020; and


WHEREAS, the thirty-day public review and comment period concluded on November 13, 2023, with zero public comments received; and

### **Summary**

The City of Fresno (City) is a federal entitlement community that receives an annual allocation of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). As an entitlement community, the City is required to prepare an Annual Action Plan detailing the uses of CDBG funds to meet its affordable housing and community development goals as outlined in its Consolidated Plan.

For Program Year 2023-2024, the City is proposing a substantial amendment to the Action Plan to reprogram \$2,580,129.32 in program savings to fund the acquisition of land to use for affordable housing development and relocation assistance for businesses impacted by the development of affordable senior housing at the site on Blackstone and Holland Avenues. This effort is in alignment with the City's goals as stated in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan to improve access to affordable housing for low-income and special needs households.

The City will accept comments on the proposed substantial amendment for a period of 30 days from October 13, 2023, through November 13, 2023.

## Sources of Funds

Substantial Amendment 2023-02 will reprogram \$2,580,129.32 in CDBG funds from project savings and activities that would not be completed in a timely enough manner to meet the CDBG required timeliness test.
