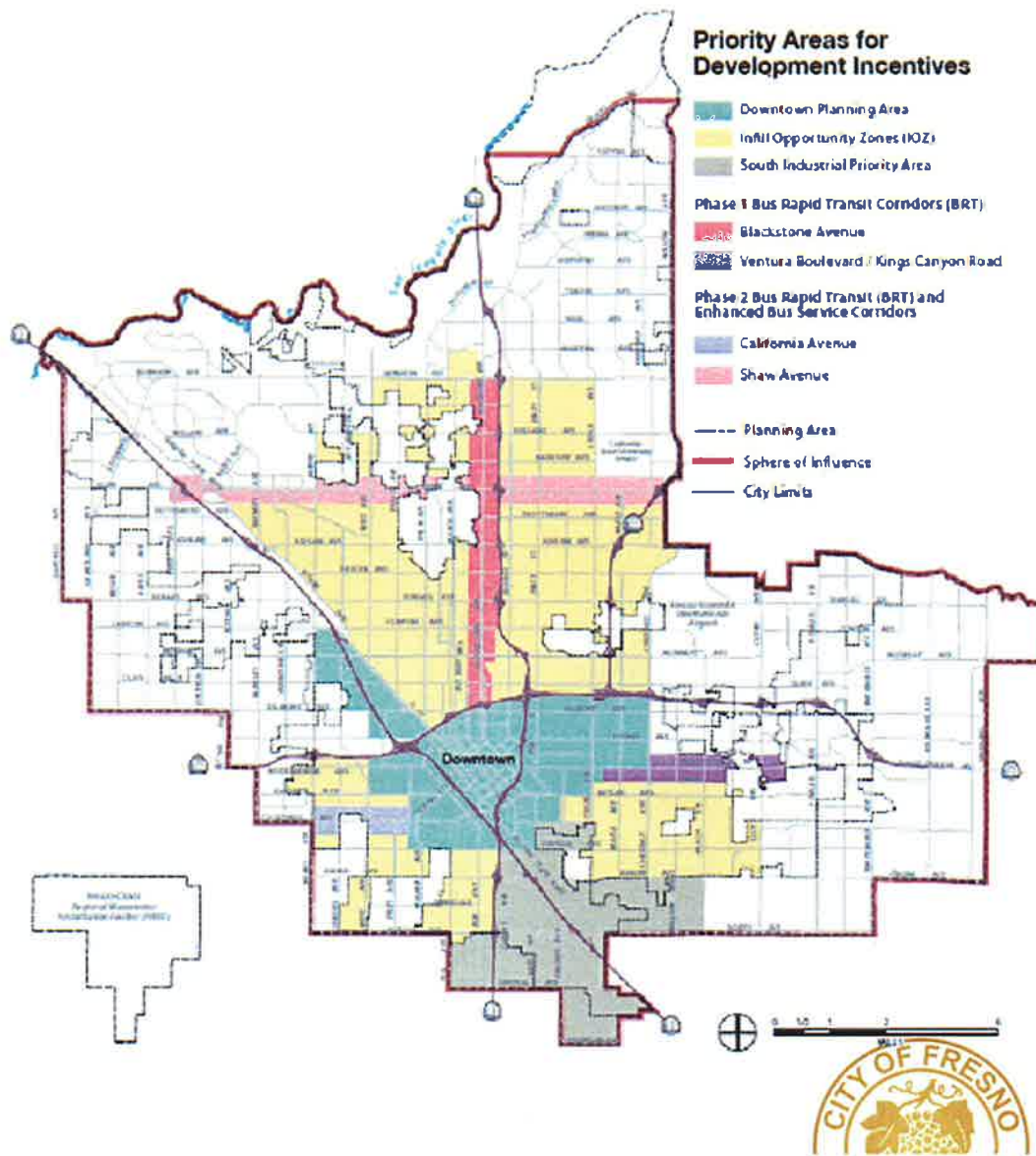

“How can we expect investment—either new construction or building rehabilitation—in neighborhoods south of Herndon when the surrounding areas have become so deteriorated?”



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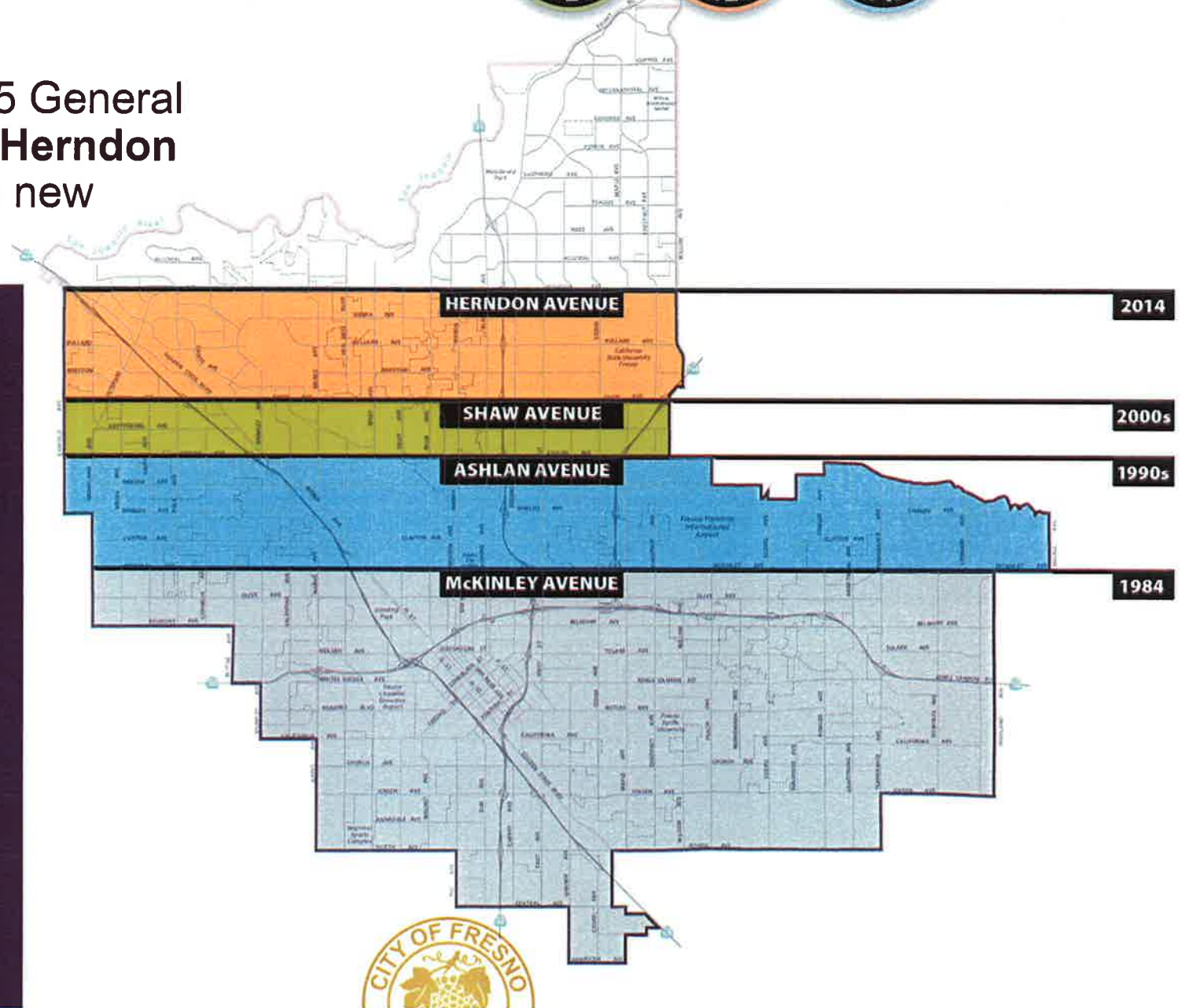
