The County should be ashamed that they aren't yet on Zoom, because local electeds should be encouraging more citizen participation. Let's not go backwards here.

If it's funding that is the issue, might there be some fat to cut in the philandering police chief's budget, perhaps the \$1.2 million for SROs, because cops don't belong in schools. I see that the problematic Axon is also on today's agenda, receiving \$18 million over 5 years.

The public deserves a voice, now more than ever. And particularly the marginalized.

The City should be looking for more ways to include citizens instead of trying to limit our participation.
