5	Fresno Emerging Documentary Filmmakers Fellowship	<p>The Fresno Emerging Documentary Filmmakers Fellowship will primarily serve zip codes 93706, 93702, 93721, 93725, and 93727— low-income South and Central Fresno neighborhoods with a long history of systematic inequities related to housing, environmental health, education and limited access to cultural resources. ZIP code 93701 encompasses downtown Fresno and adjacent neighborhoods where STCLT extends its community outreach, housing advocacy, and arts programming.
