# 9:00 A.M. Actions on the Fiscal Year 2021 Budget and related items - CONTINUED from June 25, 2020

Councilmember Soria motioned to split motions 50a and 50b into two separate motions.

Councilmember Bredefeld expressed his concerns with moving the Graffiti Abatement Division under PARCS and does not support the direction.

Councilmember Soria motioned to move the Graffiti Abatement Division from the Police Department to the PARCS Department and that the transfer include all assets, including trucks, equipment, computers, etc.

Councilmember Esparza seconded the motion. Motion PASSED 6/1,

Councilmember Bredefeld voted no.

Councilmember Soria motioned to create a pilot program to partner with an organization (art collective) to create community mural projects that will help deter graffiti. The mural pilot program shall be overseen by the PARCS Department and funded with \$100,000 set aside from the Graffiti Abatement budget. Councilmember Esparza seconded the motion. Motion PASSED 6-1, Councilmember Bredefeld voted no.

Councilmember Soria made a new motion in conjunction to Motion #51: She motioned that the Salary Resolution and Position Authorization Resolution be amended consistent with the direction in Motion #51 regarding the Office

of Neighborhood Safety and Community Engagement, to transfer the three positions from the Police Department, including the incumbent employees and all funding, to the PARCS Department, and compensating and classifying them consistent with employees with similar duties and responsibilities, subject to any meet and confer that may be necessary. Council President Arias seconded the motion. Motion PASSED 5/2, Councilmember Karbassi and Councilmember Bredefeld voted no.

Councilmember Karbassi clarified and amended his Motion #52: He motioned to add \$1.5 million to the City Attorney Office's base budget of approximately \$16.8 million for a total of \$18.3 million to be the City Attorney Budget. Councilmember Chavez seconded the motion. Motion PASSED 7-0.

Council President Arias motioned to approve the enabling budget documents as amended, and for each department to set aside 10% of their annual budget for contingency for the purpose of balancing the budget. The Council will return in 90 days to re-evaluate the budget. Councilmember Chavez seconded the motion. Motion PASSED 7-0.

Upon call, the following members of the public addressed Council: Nathan Ahle, D'Aungillique Jackson, Lisa Flores, Sam Frank, Brandi Villegas, Marisa Moraza, Grecia Elenes, Mary Curry, Kimberly McCoy, and Dez Martinez.

Councilmember Chavez expressed his support on going into depth with each department and the strategic plan for the COVID dollars.

Council Vice President Caprioglio thanked the budget subcommittee, his Council colleagues, the Finance department, and Former City Manager Bruce Rudd for their due diligence during these challenging times.

Councilmember Esparza stated he is very pleased with the process as opposed to just rolling over the budget with a resolution.

Councilmember Bredefeld clarified his vote and supported the Strategic Plan. He stated the vote should reflect a 7-0 vote.

Councilmember Soria thanked the staff, Administration, Subcommittee and the community for participating in the budget process. She mentioned several pots of money and she is proud that the Council included, mental health being the number one priority. She reminded everyone that the Council will be meeting with the County and she is hopeful that the City of Fresno and the County of Fresno can come to an agreement and the City of Fresno will get their fair share. She will be supporting the continuing Resolution and that the reserves is not off the table.

Mayor Brand thanked everyone for working together during these hard times.

Council President Arias spoke about looking into cuts and amendments to the labor agreements. He thanked staff for responding to Council's request for information and having to do this again in a few months.

Councilmember Karbassi thanked the Council staff, City Clerk, City Attorney, and the City Manager's staff.

On motion of President Arias, seconded by Councilmember Chavez, the below Action was adopted as amended. The motion carried by the following vote:
