I am representing my husband, myself, and the neighbors surrounding the area of North Winery, East Washington and McKenzie to discuss the rezone application number R-13-014. We are all very opposed to this proposed change.

The lot in question is 0.61 acres which was originally designated for the construction of one residential home. We are all in agreement that building two homes is acceptable but not three. Building three homes on that lot does not conform to the existing structure of our neighborhood. The existing lots are 120 X 120 and 120 X 60. This proposal will change the originality of our beautiful neighborhood to look more like a subdivision of track homes. The homes surrounding us are all custom built homes.

We urge you to not allow the building of three homes on that lot. The homes will have a lesser value than the existing homes due to the size of the lot and square footage of the homes.
