WHEREAS, Ron Scott, in his 30th season as head baseball coach at Fresno City College, notched his 1,000th career win on April 24, 2018, defeating Cerro Coso College 5-2 in Ridgecrest; and

WHEREAS, Ron Scott took over the baseball program at Fresno City College in 1989 from legendary coach, Len Bourdet; and

WHEREAS, Ron Scott not only succeeded the California Community College Baseball Hall of Famer, but surpassed his victory total to become the winningest coach in Fresno City College baseball history; and

WHEREAS, Ron Scott's lineups have featured many players who went on to play at four-year universities, as well as seven who made it to the Major Leagues: Bill Simas, Ted Lilly, Jaime Cerda, Marcus Walden, Sean Halton, Jason Wood and Shad Williams; and

WHEREAS, Since his first season with the Rams, Coach Scott has placed an astonishing number of players, 43, on the All-America list, at least one every year. Five of them were two-time All-Americans: Sean Halton, Andy Underwood, Jon Asabina, Sam Lopez, Lance Backowski and Jason Wood.

In the City of Fresno.

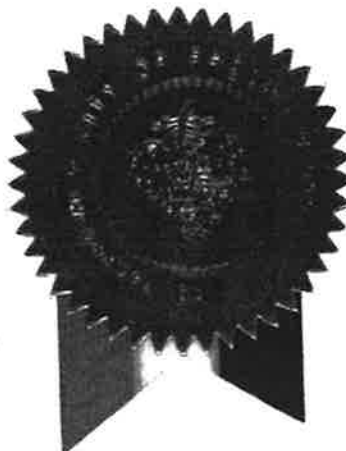
