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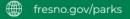

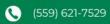

Recommendation	FY26 Adopted Budget
Allocate \$75,000 for office of neighborhood safety and community engagement focusing on female youth.	The adopted FY2026 budget did not include funding for this motion.
Allocate \$300,000 to continue the youth fee waiver program and make a minor language change so funding applies not only to individuals but also to nonprofit organizations serving low-income residents, helping them qualify for fee waivers, and increase marketing and outreach efforts to encourage higher utilization of the fee waiver.	A total of \$75,000 was adopted in the FY2026 budget (motion #34). \$50,000 was adopted for a Youth Sports scholarship program. \$25,000 was adopted to support the Youth Sports Fee Waiver Program.
\$75,000 for a mentorship program targeting youth ages 9 to 17, with a focus on academic support, workforce readiness, and general mentorship.	The adopted FY2026 PARCS budget did not include funding for this motion.







Recommendation	FY26 Budget
Allocate up to \$75,000 to engage a consultant to evaluate the sustainability and conservation aspects related to the park landscape maintenance operations.	The adopted FY2026 budget did not include funding for this motion.
Allocate \$300,000 to the Al Radka lighting project, to cover the design work and any environmental work that needs to go into the project.	The FY2026 adopted budget did not include funding for Al Radka lighting project.
Allocate up to \$100,000 for the design and construction of a shade structure for the small dog park at Roeding.	The FY2026 adopted budget includes funding for other projects at Roeding Park such as: Pickleball/Futsal/Basketball courts installation, park bench replacement, restroom replacement, and Storyland improvement.
Dedicate \$50,000 to explore grants in the name of Dr Francine Oputa.	The adopted FY2026 budget did not include funding for this motion.

Exploring how we can get the Blue Heron up.	This motion did not include a request for funding.
\$100,000 be allocated to continue to expand the arts and culture development of cultural arts district in Southeast Fresno.	The adopted FY2026 budget did not include funding for this motion.
Allocate up to \$150,000 for Fresno Arts Council's administration, translation and related services of the Expanded Access to Arts and Culture Grant Program.	The FY2026 budget includes \$75,000 in General Fund appropriations to the Arts Council for outreach/administration of the arts and culture funds (motion #5).
\$657,300 for a tot lot at Fink-White Park.	The FY2026 adopted budget includes funding for restroom rehabilitation at Fink White.
\$2.3 million allocated to the replacement of restrooms at Nielson Park.	The FY2026 adopted budget includes \$714,988 in Measure P appropriations for play structure improvement at Nielsen Park.

Allocation of \$300k to start a park related project planning process for the development of a plaza type center for the unused portion of the site. (Southeast corner of 7th and Cesar Chavez).	A Resolution for the property at 7th and Cesar Chavez was passed by council on 4/24/25 to build affordable housing.
To support the PARCS Department FY26 Budget as presented by PARCS, DPU, DPW and PD.	FY2026 PARCS Department Budget adopted.

Recommendation	FY26 Adopted Budget
Allocate up to \$150,000 for the camp Pashayan project as part of Bucket 5 San Joaquin Parkway.	The FY2026 adopted budget includes \$250,000 for San Joaquin River Parkway minor capital projects. Public Works is in discussions with the Conservancy and Parkway Trust regarding highest priority projects. A cost estimate is currently being updated for Camp Pashayan.
Allocate up to a million dollars to the River West project to help complete the core project.	The Mayor's Proposed Budget included \$2,000,000 in Measure C Trails funding and \$500,000 in Measure P San Joaquin River Parkway funds for the FY2027 capital budget, to coincide with the schedule to award the construction contract also including the State grant funds.
Allocate an amount not to exceed \$150,000 to River West to open the property to the public.	This motion was not funded in the adopted budget.
An amount not to exceed \$50,000 for planning, design, and implementation from category 5 for the area along the San Joaquin Trust.	The FY2026 adopted budget includes \$250,000 for San Joaquin River Parkway minor capital projects. Public Works is in discussions with the Conservancy and Parkway Trust regarding the highest priority projects.
