A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, TO ADOPT SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT 2024-01 TO THE FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2024-2025 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN AND AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPEMNT (HUD) TO REPROGRAM \$1,214,423.49 IN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) AND \$135,571.41 IN HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP (HOME) FUNDS FROM PRIOR YEAR PROJECT SAVINGS.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires jurisdictions that receive federal entitlement program funds to prepare an Annual Action Plan, which identifies the projects to be funded with CDBG and HOME funds; and

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2024, the City Council adopted Resolution 2024-105, approving the City of Fresno (City) FY 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City has identified \$1,349,994.90 in project savings; and

WHEREAS, the City has prepared Substantial Amendment 2024-01 to the FY 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan, consistent with the five-year Consolidated Plan, which the City Council adopted on May 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the thirty-day public review and comment period concluded on March 14, 2025, with five public comments received; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to submit Substantial Amendment No. 2024-01 (Exhibit "A") to the FY 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan to HUD to reflect changes made by the City Council.

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Summary

The City of Fresno (City) is a federal entitlement community that receives an annual allocation of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). As an entitlement community, the City is required to prepare an Annual Action Plan detailing the uses of CDBG and HOME funds to meet its affordable housing and community development goals as outlined in its Consolidated Plan.

For Program Year 2024-2025, the City is proposing to make a substantial amendment to its submitted plan. The purpose for the substantial amendment is to reprogram funds from program savings and other sources to demolition in support of affordable housing development, housing rehabilitation, and Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA).

To reprogram the funds, a substantial amendment is required. On February 12, 2025, the City published Substantial Amendment 2024-01 to the 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan for the required 30-day public comment period. These efforts are in alignment with the City's 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan goal to increase access to affordable housing.

Sources of Programmed Funds

Substantial Amendment 2024-01 will reprogram \$1,214,423.49 of CDBG funds and \$135,571.41 of HOME funds to support affordable housing development through demolition, exterior repairs, and rental assistance.
