Lupus Awareness Month

WHEREAS, Systemic Lupus Erythematosus, referred to as SLE or Lupus, is a chronic autoimmune disease that afflicts over 500,000 people in the United States According to the Lupus Foundation of America. Over 90% of those diagnosed with Lupus are women. Women of color are disproportionately afflicted with Lupus, as studies have shown that the disease burden of SLE is highest in Black Women, followed by Latinas, and Asian Women; and

WHEREAS, Lupus is an unpredictable and misunderstood autoimmune disease causing the immune system to attack healthy tissue damaging different organ systems. It can affect the skin, joints, kidneys, the lining of the lungs, heart, and brain. Many patients experience low grade fever, fatigue, hair loss and Raynaud's disease. Lupus is a great mimicker and can be difficult to diagnose early on. It is difficult to diagnose, hard to live with and a challenge to treat. Many of the debilitating symptoms and impacts of Lupus are subjective, like fatigue, joint pain, having flu like symptoms to the more obvious clinical signs of damage to the organs like the kidneys, heart and lungs. Because many of these symptoms are invisible, it can often leave those living with Lupus feeling misunderstood and isolated; and

WHEREAS, Through consistent work with individuals battling Lupus, board certified rheumatologist and internist Dr. Manisha Mittal, of Fresno has assisted numerous people in learning how to better manage Lupus and maintain a quality of life. Dr. Mittal practices integrative medicine and advocates for healthier lifestyle choices, diet, exercise, meditation, and medication as key interventions; and

WHEREAS, In 2018 Dr. Mittal established the Moksha Holistic Center located in Fresno. The center focuses on Ayurveda, the science of life and longevity, and holistic healing, to promote wellbeing and disease management for women battling Lupus. In addition, she advocates for investment to find a cure for Lupus as a Board Member for the California Lupus Foundation; and
