I am writing to express my strong support for several important community investments being considered by the City.

\$250,000 for the South Tower Community Land Trust facility on Fulton Street

This project represents a long-term investment in community ownership, neighborhood revitalization, housing stability, and economic opportunity. The Fulton Street facility will serve as a permanent hub where residents can access resources, participate in community-driven solutions, and build a stronger future for their neighborhood. South Tower Community Land Trust has a proven track record of creating equitable development that benefits existing residents and helps prevent displacement. This investment will create a lasting community asset that strengthens families, supports local leadership, and ensures resources remain rooted in the community for generations to come.

\$30,000 for the Tower District Library

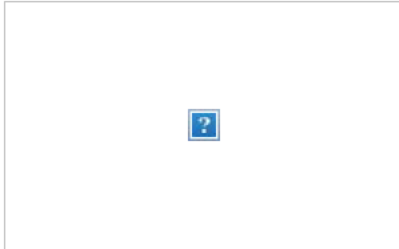

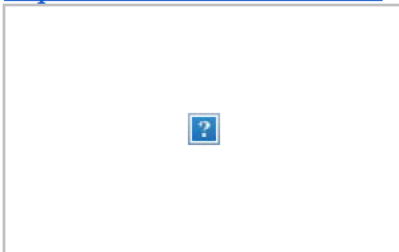
