
Supplemental Information:

<u>Notes</u>

- <u>FY 2022</u>: The Mayor & City Manager Department included the Office of Community Affairs and the Office of Independent Review. The budget also included \$805,480 in Animal Center capital construction costs.
- FY 2023: The Department added, the Office of Emergency Preparedness and the Office of Special Events, and added two support personnel for the Cannabis program
- <u>FY 2024</u>: The Animal Center, and Budget Division became stand-alone departments. \$600,000 budgeted in FY 2023 for Animal Center construction was not budgeted in FY 2024, and the Department's FY 2024 budget was decreased by \$1,006,371 in Cannabis Equity Grant funds fully expended in FY 2023.

The FY 2025 Proposed Budget includes: the Office's of Community Affairs, Independent Review, Emergency Preparedness, and Special Events

- > Reductions in Personnel Services of 6.18% or \$240,400 corresponds to planned attrition/salary savings
- > Reductions Non-Personnel Services of 3.0% or \$176,500 contributes to the balancing the General Fund
- > A transfer of \$400,000 associated with the warming/cooling centers moved from PARCS to the Department's Office of Emergency Preparedness
