
Veteran's Hospital Parking District Amendment

Background

- Parking District established in 2018
- Parking District modified in 2020
- Further requests to modify district received by City
- Survey conducted in November 2021
- Town Hall meeting on proposed new boundaries and enforcement schedule conducted in September 2022



Parking Survey Methodology

- Questionnaire was distributed to 679 addresses in the parking district area in November of 2021
- 122 surveys were returned = 18% response rate
- Survey purpose: further refine parking district boundaries and hours of enforcement

Parking Survey Methodology

- **Anonymity** – Survey did not ask for addresses. This limited our ability to map out responses by address. However we were able to map them out by street.
- **Data Interpretation** - In spite of the limitations, and combined with staff observation of the area, the data indicates that respondents who live farther away from the VA Hospital are less likely to experience parking congestion.





Do you want your street included?




Recommended Enforcement Times



Start Time Response Summary




End Time Response Summary



Summary

- 53% of survey respondents support the current parking permit system, 45% oppose it, and 3% don't know or didn't respond.
- The majority of respondents on Michigan and Cornell Avenues do not support the district or want their street included in the district.
- The most favored parking enforcement time frame was 7:00 am – 5:00 p.m.

Town Hall Meeting


- Purpose: Validate parking survey conclusions

Feedback

- Request for increased parking enforcement in the area
- Request to include Michigan Ave between Fresno St and Angus St
- Request to include Mariposa St between Michigan Ave and Princeton Ave
- Request to include Angus St between Michigan Ave and Princeton Ave
- Residents parking vehicles on their lawn is a concern
