5	Soli Deo Gloria Patriotic Celebration	Soli Deo Gloria currently performs and provides programming in the City of Fresno within the zip codes 93710, 93730, and 93721. These areas include northeast Fresno and the downtown corridor, encompassing both middle- and upper-income neighborhoods and areas with access to established cultural venues such as educational institutions and public performance spaces. In alignment with Measure P's commitment to equitable geographic access and the Cultural Arts Plan's goals to engage underserved communities, Soli Deo Gloria intends to expand its service area to include additional zip codes with demonstrated need and cultural potential. 10	Pixel & Paint	Pixel & Paint is committed to serving children and families in some of the most underserved areas of the City of Fresno—communities where access to high-quality arts and digital learning experiences is often limited or entirely absent. Our program will focus on neighborhoods that rank high in need due to factors such as concentrated poverty, underfunded schools, and a lack of safe, enriching spaces for youth. Our pop-up workshops will be hosted onsite at affordable housing communities and neighborhood-based libraries in the five most impacted ZIP codes in Fresno, which include: 93701, 93702, 93706, 93721, and 93725. These ZIP codes reflect areas where families often face systemic barriers including economic hardship, limited transportation, and language access challenges. Many residents are part of immigrant, refugee, or farmworker communities, and children in these neighborhoods are less likely to have access to extracurricular programs that affirm their identities and build creative or digital skills. By bringing Pixel & Paint directly into these areas, we eliminate common participation barriers such as cost, transportation, and unfamiliarity with traditional institutional settings. Each workshop location is intentionally selected based on its proximity to youth who may benefit most, as well as the ability to collaborate with local partners such as resident coordinators, library staff, and community organizations. Programming will be offered at no cost, with all materials and technology provided onsite. To culminate the project and celebrate the creativity of participating children, we will host a Gallery Walk Celebration at the United Way of Fresno and Madera Counties, a centrally located venue that is accessible to families across all five ZIP codes.
