- WHEREAS, breast cancer remains one of the leading causes of death both nationally and globally. 1 in 8 women in the U.S. will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime, and approximately 1 in 43 will die from the disease. Research shows higher incidences of breast cancer within the San Joaquin Valley, posing a major challenge to the health and well-being of our community; and
- WHEREAS, individuals who have limited access to healthcare, are older, or have a lower socioeconomic status are less likely to receive regular screenings for breast cancer and, therefore, likely to be diagnosed at a later stage with lower chances of survival; and
- WHEREAS, the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program has supported underserved groups by improving access to early detection and screening services, increasing survival rates by diagnosing individuals at early stages and affirming the importance of cancer education and equitable healthcare access; and
- WHEREAS, breast cancer not only deeply affects those diagnosed, but also impacts family members, friends, and entire communities, introducing complex emotional, physical, and financial challenges; and
- WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society's work through investments in breast cancer research, ensuring greater access to quality care, advocacy for public policy, and providing patient support has played a key role in the reducing the female breast cancer death rate; and
- WHEREAS, Breast Cancer Awareness Month is a time to honor those battling cancer, remember the lives lost, celebrate survivors, and recognize the tireless efforts of all those in our community working towards a cure to end this disease; and
- WHEREAS, on this 30th day of October, the City of Fresno encourages all Fresno residents to take an active role in cancer prevention, raise awareness, support local organizations, and advocate for expanded access to care and early detection resources to improve community health;
