FAX BUS STOP ADA UPGRADES**

PROJECT LOCATION: Fresno Area Express (FAX) bus stops at 17 existing locations within the city limits of Fresno. (See attached Location Map)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The proposed project proposes to remediate 17 bus stops located within the City of Fresno to remove the deficiencies notated in the FAX ADA Transition plan. The deficiencies identified in the ADA Transition Plan listed as Priority 1, will include replacement and repairs of existing sidewalks, curbs, gutters, and general accessibility improvements. The remediation work will also serve to provide safer bus stops and an improved customer experience at each of the project stops. No right-of-way is being acquired as part of this project. These improvements will add safety features and accessibility amenities that will be beneficial to the public who use the FAX bus transportation system. No permanent traffic lane removals or changes will occur.

This project is exempt under Section 15301/Class 1 and Section 15302(c)/Class 2 of the State of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines. None of the exceptions to Categorical Exemptions set forth in the CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2 apply to this project.

EXPLANATION:

Section 15301/Class 1 consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The types of "existing facilities" itemized are not intended to be all inclusive of the types of projects which might fall within Class 1. The key consideration is whether the project involves negligible or no expansion of use. According to code section 15301 (d), examples of exempt work include the rehabilitation and restoration of deteriorated or damaged structures to meet current standards of public health and safety. This project will provide public transportation improvements to 17 existing bus stops at various locations within the city limits of Fresno and will involve negligible expansion of capacity. These improvements will add safety features and accessible pathways at each of the 17 bus stops, which will be beneficial to the public who use the FAX bus transportation system.

Section 15302(c)/Class 2 consists of replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have

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substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced, including but not limited to: (c) replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity. The proposed reconstruction of 17 existing FAX bus stops at various locations within the city limits of Fresno will provide additional safety features and accessible pathways that will benefit FAX ridership, and the reconstruction will involve negligible expansion of capacity.

The area in which each of the 17 existing bus stops is located is not environmentally sensitive, is served by all required utilities and public services, and is surrounded by urban uses. The proposed project includes only minor alterations and accessibility upgrades which will not negatively impact the existing characteristics of the respective areas or the condition of land. The project will repair existing sidewalks, curbs, and include general accessibility improvements within public rights-of-way and will provide enhancements for public health and safety purposes. The proposed project will positively contribute to promoting reductions in vehicle miles traveled, automobile delays and to greenhouse gas emissions through the further development of multimodal transportation networks.

Based on staff analysis, it has been determined that no adverse environmental impacts will occur as a result of the proposed project. None of the exceptions to Categorical Exemptions set forth in the CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2 apply to this project. Furthermore, the proposed project is not expected to have a significant effect on the environment. Accordingly, as the area is not environmentally sensitive, as noted above, a categorical exemption has been prepared for the project.
