BACKGROUND OF PROJECT (To be completed by Evaluating Department/Division. Explain need for project/equipment):

This neighborhood is being served by undersized and aging water mains, several of which are located in easements that extend across the backyards of the residents. Primarily due to their age, these water mains tend to have frequent failures that disrupt service to the customer, waste water through leakage and can impede fire service. This project will install larger water mains and new services within the street right-of-way and abandon the existing water mains. Each existing service connection will be transferred to the new water mains.

In addition to the City's water improvements, this project includes the installation of 900 linear-feet of 15-inch storm drain pipe, four (4) manholes and one (1) inlet for the Fresno Metropolitan Flood Control District (FMFCD) per the District's request, with funding for the cost

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of the work secured through a reimbursement agreement with the District. The storm drain work was added to eliminate any future disturbance and inconvenience to residences.

DEPARTMENT CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION:

Award a contract in the amount of \$3,559,128.00 to Teichert Construction of Fresno, California as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.


