A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING A PROGRAM PROVIDING ZERO FARE FOR SENIORS, MEDICARE CARD HOLDERS, AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITY PLACARDS

WHEREAS, Fresno Area Express (FAX), the City's bus transit system, operates eighteen routes and 119 buses, including the Q, the City's bus rapid transit system; and

WHEREAS, seniors aged 65 and older, many of whom are on a fixed income, Medicare card holders, and persons with disability placards need transportation to medical appointments, vaccination clinics, bill payment centers, grocery stores, Covid-19 testing services, work, and other general services; and

WHEREAS, Kaiser Permanente has dedicated \$500,000 to the City of Fresno towards the overall efforts of making local public transportation more affordable for all riders; and

WHEREAS, providing a zero-fare program through a subsidy afforded by the grant award from Kaiser Permanente to seniors 65 and older, Medicare card holders, and persons with disability placards, will have substantial social and economic benefits to the residents of Fresno; and

WHEREAS, the Central Valley is known to have some of the worst air quality in the country, with hundreds of thousands of residents experiencing asthma or other respiratory health issues; and

WHEREAS, gas prices have increased to an unprecedented amount, creating a burden to residents on a fixed or low income; and

WHEREAS, providing seniors 65 and older, Medicare card holders, and persons with disability placards, subsidized fare may encourage more Fresno residents to use public transit instead of driving alone, thereby decreasing traffic, reducing congestion and harmful emissions; and

WHEREAS, this program, when coupled with a mandate to convert the FAX bus fleet to zero emissions by 2040, state laws requiring new development to utilize vehicle miles traveled mitigation strategies, and recent investments in local infill development will lead to a more walkable city, reduce barriers to transportation, and provide healthier outcomes for our most impacted residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fresno as follows:

- 1. The Administration shall temporarily subsidize bus fares on fixed route transit buses for seniors 65 and older, Medicare card holders, and persons with disability placards commencing July 1, 2022, until grant funds have been expended.
- 2. The Administration is authorized to execute the grant documents and shall accept and use the \$500,000 grant from Kaiser Permanente to subsidize the fares that would otherwise have been received from seniors 65 and older, Medicare card holders, and persons with disability placards.
- 3. Prior to the initiation of this program, the FAX Department will provide educational awareness about this program.
- 4. There shall be no decrease in current routes or services as an effect of this resolution.
