BACKGROUND OF PROJECT (To be completed by Evaluating Department/Division. Explain need for project/equipment):

The Kings River Pipeline (KRP) consists of the construction of a roughly 13 mile long, 72-inch diameter raw water pipeline to deliver water from the Kings River to the Southeast Surface Water Treatment Facility (SESWTF) for treatment to meet drinking water standards. "Raw water" is simply untreated water that requires treatment to drinking water standards prior to delivering to the public for consumption. Conveyance through the pipeline, as opposed to through canals, enables better source water protection and improves raw water quality to the SESWTF. Construction of this pipeline will reduce operational costs and provide a high quality of source water. This is one of the major projects under Recharge Fresno Program that will provide a more sustainable water supply for the City of Fresno by reducing dependence on groundwater.

Eight (8) sealed bid proposals were received and publicly opened on March 15, 2016. Garney Construction was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder submitting a bid price in the amount of \$45,583,750. The Staff Determination of Award will be posted on the City's website when this evaluation is approved. The remaining seven (7) bids ranged in price from \$45,791,600 to \$58,521,150.

DEPARTMENT CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION:

Award a contract in the amount of \$45,583,750 to Garney Construction as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.
