The Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC) met in regular session in the Conference Room #2165 at Fresno City Hall on the date and time above written.

1. CALL TO ORDER.

Chair Nick Yovino Jr. called the meeting to order at 5:31 PM.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA.

The above item was called to order at 5:32 PM.

4. UNSCHEDULED COMMUNICATIONS/PUBLIC COMMENT.

The above item was called to order at 5:34 PM.

Upon call, no member of the public addressed the Committee during unscheduled communication.

5. OTHER BUSINESS.

[ID 26-224](#) Presentation on the Active Transportation Plan. (Public Works Department)

The above item was called to order at 5:35 PM and presented to the Committee by Andreina Aguilar, Public Works.

Committee comments and recommendations were as follows: Lack of details on intersections and ways to address collisions at intersections, request to upgrade Class II to Class IV and allow feasibility studies to dictate achievability, clarification on the feasibility of the proposed network; inquiry on how the Complete Streets plan becomes enforceable, need for greenways; noticed no bike lane proposed on Shepherd and Friant; expectation to review near-term priority projects due to budget constraints

and plan updates every five to ten years, clarification needed on the respective departments responsible for the implementation of those near-term projects; inquiry on funding of projects, prioritization factors when creating the network; lack of accessibility to review the plan due to its size and multiple attachments, no clear goals with certain timeframes, need for intentional approaches to multimodal mobility, requested for Chapter 6 to be moved to Chapter 3, inclusion of California Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance, slow streets, open streets and play streets, clarification on the order of goals, clarification on city departments coordination and partnerships, addition of greening or landscaping as an equity criterion, recommendation to include heat-adapted design standards, clarification on the design standards, analysis of the maps validity and feasibility of proposed networks; appreciation of the educational toolkit; clarification on next steps, discussion on plan's timeline and expectations.

Staff provided responses where possible and will ensure comments, questions, and recommendations are shared with the consultant for further review.

Upon call, the following members of the public addressed the Committee with unscheduled communication: Matthew Ward, Tina Sumner, Nick Paladino, and Tony Molina.

6. TASK FORCE REPORTS.

[ID 26-222](#) Discussion on the Protected Bicycle Parking Task Force.

The above item was called to order at 7:02 PM.

Vice Chair Zweifler shared that there was nothing to report at the time.

[ID 26-223](#) Discussion on the Bike Month 2026 Task Force.

The above item was called to order at 7:03 PM.

Chair Yovino Jr. provided a few updates on the Mayor's Bike Ride and potential meetings with Councilmembers to discuss the Park to Park event. Vice Chair Zweifler shared the tentative Mayor's Bike Ride route and discussed Fresno County Bicycle Coalition's support. Member Gromis provided clarification on the two May events. Staff will reach out to PARCS

on potential collaboration opportunities.

7. MEMBER REPORTS AND COMMENTS.

The above item was called to order at 7:07 PM.

DISTRICT 1 - VICE CHAIR ZWEIFLER REPORTS AND COMMENTS: provided additional comments on the ATP. Proposed for consultant and staff to review potential Class III routes like: McKinley, Princeton, Teilman, and Crystal.

DISTRICT 3 - BOARD MEMBER BAILEY REPORTS AND COMMENTS: shared continued issue of cars parking in bike lanes especially between Roosevelt and Palm; shared issues of bollards being run over and some even taken out by someone with a drill; recommended the use of rubber curbs instead.

DISTRICT 6 - BOARD MEMBER DURHAM REPORTS AND COMMENTS: provided an update on District 6's upcoming quarterly town hall meeting and attended a Beautify Fresno event where they were able to talk with their Councilmember.

MAYORAL ELECT - BOARD MEMBER MARQUEZ REPORTS AND COMMENTS: provided updates on the Active Transportation Program Cycle 8.

DISTRICT 4 - BOARD MEMBER MINE REPORTS AND COMMENTS: introduced themselves; provided insight and concerns of e-scooters from the Association Students, Inc. at Fresno State; inquired on how the city plans to implement and incorporate more north-south connectivity to campus for students due to the increase of scooter usage.

DISTRICT 2 - CHAIR GROMIS REPORTS AND COMMENTS: shared their concerns about the use of Class 3 e-bikes on Class I facilities, citing personal experience and dangerous high-speed encounters on Van Ness and Lewis Easton Trails; continued concerns about golf cart usage in their neighborhood; shared appreciation for the HAWK on Maroa and the need for

roadway education; recommended for a HAWK to be installed at Fruit and Messa, near Rata High School; encouraged the use of HAWKS around schools to increase safety;
