In the 2000's I had the opportunity to serve on the FRWDB for a number of years. At the time, I was the CEO and COO of One by One Leadership, a local nonprofit involved in improving the downtown region, with a focus on economic and workforce development. In 2006, I became the Chief Technology Officer for Fresno Unified and held that position for 15 years. During that time, I served on several community boards that were involved in economic and workforce development, including Fresno EDC, Fresno Business Council, One by One Leadership and Fresno COMPACT. When I left Fresno Unified in 2021, I launched Career Nexus, a nonprofit based in downtown Fresno dedicated to enhancing career opportunities for young adults through paid internships. We are involved in the City of Fresno's Youth Job Corp Program as well as other workforce related initiatives in Fresno.
