As of July. 14,2024, I have yet to receive the requested documentation from the planning office (I just emailed my request July 12,2024), therefore some of my questions may be answered or moot.

- 1. Valley Fever
- 2. Dust causing asthmatic, heart and breathing health issues
- 3. Contamination of soil trash -illegal dumping currently on land

The middle school currently being constructed at Brawley and Shields, has been observed only watering the grounder 1x during the pre construction.

My understanding is that the land area is to be wetted during the entire pre construction period, to minimize the environmental impact of the soil.
