#### FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO GRANT AGREEMENT (First Amendment) is effective as of December 12, 2024, and amends the Grant Agreement with Lighthouse for Children to provide funding to partner with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program between the City of Fresno, a California municipal corporation (CITY), and Lighthouse for Children, a California Non-profit Corporation (GRANTEE).

#### **RECITALS**

- A. Whereas, the CITY and GRANTEE are parties to that certain Grant Agreement for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program dated November 21, 2024 (Agreement); and
- B. Whereas, pursuant to the Agreement, the CITY has issued to GRANTEE Program Funds in relation to support of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program utilizing American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding; and
- C. Whereas, the CITY and GRANTEE now desire to modify the scope of services and award additional funding in order to complete all program activities and expend all allocated funding.

#### **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals, which recitals are contractual in nature, the mutual promises herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged, the parties agree that the aforesaid agreement be amended as follows:

- 1. **Grant Amount.** Providing an additional award amount of \$75,375 to the existing \$150,000 for a total of \$225,375 in program funding to be distributed in accordance with section 2 of the Agreement.
- 2. **Exhibit A Scope of Work, Budget and Metrics**. Amending and restating the scope of work, budget and metrics to increase the number of children served in the City of Fresno with the additional award amount.
- 3. **Effect of Amendment**. Except as expressly modified by this First Amendment, the Agreement is hereby reaffirmed and ratified. In the event of any conflict between the Agreement or any Exhibits and this First Amendment, this First Amendment shall control.

#### **Executive Summary**

Through the Dollywood Foundation, the Lighthouse for Children, Inc. will help facilitate the local Dolly Parton Imagination Library Book program providing age-appropriate English and Spanish books to Fresno's young children.

#### **Services Description**

Through the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, the Lighthouse for Children, Inc. will act as the Local Program Partner to facilitate the local Book program providing age-appropriate English and Spanish books to children from birth to their fifth birthday.

Lighthouse for Children, Inc. will coordinate with local organizations to outreach to families with young children to register online for the program to receive free books every month through age five. Community Benefit Organizations (CBOs) will help sign families up during their outreach events, health fairs, produce distribution, and other family-centered events.

#### **Goals and Objectives**

Making use of the state match opportunity for a local Dolly Parton Imagination Library program, we hope that every child in Fresno has access to books, regardless of their family's income. We want to reach at least 1,500 kids in city of Fresno including those in the most under resourced neighborhoods to include zip codes 93702, 93706, 93722, 93726, & 93727.
