1 Pasifika Arts Project	Geographically, we are focused on serving communities in the 93727, 93702, 93741, and 93704 zip codes—areas with a high concentration of low to mid-income households and limited access to culturally specific arts opportunities. These neighborhoods represent diverse populations and include many families who face financial barriers to arts participation. By offering accessible, low-cost programming rooted in community traditions, we hope to foster cultural pride, strengthen family bonds, and make the arts more inclusive across Fresno. 2 Womxn 2 Womxn	We serve Downtown Fresno (93721), West Fresno (93706), and the Tower District (93728)—neighborhoods at the heart of our programming and outreach. Our studio is inside the Sun Stereo Warehouse in Downtown Fresno, where we host most workshops and events. These zip codes represent some of the city’s most underserved communities, especially for women and youth facing economic barriers, as shown by Healthy Fresno County’s recent data. Our commitment to equity in the arts extends to SouthEast Fresno as well. We’ve begun building partnerships with local schools, such as Sunnyside High School, to ensure creative opportunities reach even more young people. By focusing on these primary zip codes and collaborating with local institutions, we align our efforts with Fresno’s Cultural Arts Plan to broaden access to the arts. 3 Fresno Filmworks Inc	Fresno Filmworks primarily serves neighborhoods in central Fresno, downtown, and the Tower District. Our key service ZIP codes include 93704, 93741, 93728, 93701, 93721, and 93703. These areas include venues such as Fresno City College, the Fresno Art Museum, and community spaces that are geographically central and accessible to a wide range of residents. 4 The Fools Collaborative	Most of our work takes place in District One, specifically within the Tower District. The Fools Collaborative is primarily based in Fresno’s 93728, 93704, 93705, and 93721 ZIP codes—primarily serving the Tower District, West Central, and Downtown areas—but our programming over time has reached communities across the city, including 93701, 93702, 93703, 93704, 93706, 93710, 93711, 93720, 93722, 93723, 93725, 93726, 93727, and 93730. We’ve even performed in downtown Clovis (93612) and Selma (93662), with hopes of one day touring one or more of our simplified under-an-hour productions across multiple other Valley cities. 5 Tower District Preservation Fund	We focus on the Tower District Specific Plan Area in zip codes 93704 and 93728. The area is very diverse with multiple races, ethnicities, income levels, gender identities, and ages. Data from the consultants to the Tower District Specific Plan Update show a racial makeup of 43% white alone, 27% some other race alone, 17% two or more races, 6% Black alone, 4% Native American or Alaska Native alone, and 3% Asian alone. Data on ethnicity shows 53% Hispanic or Latino, and 47% not Hispanic or Latino. However, our work and our projects don’t serve just the Tower District, but the greater Fresno area as well. Our Tower Jazz Series attracted musicians and attendees from zip codes across the Fresno metropolitan area. The Tower, as a Cultural Arts District, is a destination for people throughout the Region. Sound urban planning and a vibrant arts and culture scene in the Tower can benefit other central Fresno communities. 10	Root Access Hackerspace	Root Access is located in the Tower District and serves residents from across the City of Fresno. As a makerspace and creative community hub, our physical location makes us especially accessible to neighborhoods in central and west Fresno, but our programs are open to anyone in the city. The primary ZIP codes we serve include (but are not limited to): 93728 (Tower District) - 93701, 93704, 93705 (Central & Downtown Fresno) - 93703, 93722, 93702 (Eat & West Fresno) - 93710, 93711, 93726 (North & Northeast Fresno) We are located on the FAX #28 bus line, which provides direct access for residents who rely on public transportation. Several of our members and class participants use the bus system to get to the space. Because we are a community-oriented, volunteer-run space, we do not limit our services to a specific neighborhood or demographic. 11	The William Saroyan House Museum (Renaissance Cultural Foundation)	The William Saroyan House Museum is located at [REDACTED], Fresno, CA 93705, and serves a wide range of communities across Fresno city and county, with layered engagement extending throughout the Central Valley and into diaspora communities through digital outreach and partnerships. Our primary service area includes several Fresno zip codes such as 93701–93706, 93710–93711, and 93722, which encompass many low-income, Title I-designated neighborhoods. These communities are reached through onsite museum tours, educational field trips, and free or low-cost cultural workshops. Our secondary service area includes nearby Central Valley cities such as Clovis, Visalia, Madera, and Merced (e.g., zip codes 93611, 93612, 93619, 93277, 93637, 95340), where we offer mobile exhibits, teacher professional development days, and school collaborations. In addition, the museum serves diaspora hubs—particularly Armenian-American populations in Los Angeles County (91201–91210, 91501–91506), the Bay Area (94133, 95126), and the East Coast (02472, 10028)—through virtual events, hybrid exhibitions, and partnerships with Armenian cultural institutions and schools.
