<p><b>PROJECT DESCRIPTION:</b></p> <p>Environmental Assessment Application No. TPM-2012-06 was filed by Yamabe &amp; Horn Engineering, Inc., on behalf of Denken Farms. The applicant proposed to subdivide the subject property and create a 20-parcel industrial subdivision, dedicate property for public street rights-of-way including City of Fresno acceptance of new public street alignments and widths to serve the proposed project, and install and construct both public and private facilities and infrastructure in accordance with the standards, specifications and policies of the City of Fresno. The project will result in site improvements for the future development of a proposed industrial park yielding up to 2,125,728 square feet of building floor area. Since the analysis, a major employer has proposed purchasing significant acreage in the project footprint and that employer has asked the City to enter into an Economic Incentive Agreement with the City of Fresno for the construction of a business activity center(s) which could include up to 1,875 employees. The Economic Incentive Agreement is based on job creation.</p> <p>On March 20, 2015 the City of Fresno, as the Lead Agency, filed the Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared for Environmental Assessment No. TPM-2012-06. This Mitigated Negative Declaration considered and evaluated the potential effects associated with the proposed project.</p> <p>The proposed project, with the Economic Incentive Agreement, will not have a significant impact. It may</p>		

be determined that: (1) The project does not significantly exceed the scope of Environmental Assessment Application No. TPM-2012-06; (2) No substantial changes are proposed in the project which require major revisions to the previous environmental finding due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects; (3) No substantial changes will occur with respect to the circumstances under which the project is undertaken; and, (4) No new information, which was not known and could not have been known, at the time the environmental finding for Environmental Assessment No. TPM-2012-08 was adopted, has become available.

Therefore, the City of Fresno has determined that an addendum to Environmental Assessment Application No. TPM-2012-06 is appropriate given that none of the conditions described in Section 15162 of the CEQA Guidelines calling for preparation of a subsequent negative declaration have occurred; and, new information added is only for the purposes of providing minor changes or additions, in accordance with Section 15164 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Section 15162 provides that when a negative declaration has been adopted for a project, no subsequent negative declaration shall be prepared for that project unless the lead agency determines, on the basis of substantial evidence in the light of the whole record, one or more of the following:

**FINDINGS PURSUANT TO SECTION 15162 OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES.**


(1) *Substantial changes are proposed in the project which would require major revisions of the previous negative declaration due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects;*

<i>Finding (1):</i>	The entrance into the Economic Incentive Agreement with the City of Fresno for Project Wilson does not involve new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects.
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(2) *Substantial changes occur with respect to the circumstances under which the project is undertaken which will require major revisions of the previous Negative Declaration due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects; or,*

<i>Finding (2):</i>	Substantial changes have not occurred with respect to the circumstances under which the project is undertaken.
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(3) *New information of substantial importance, which was not known and could not have been known with the exercise of reasonable diligence at the time the previous Negative Declaration was adopted, shows any of the following: (A) The project will have one or more significant effects not discussed in the previous negative declaration; (B) Significant effects previously examined will be substantially more severe than shown in the previous negative declaration; (C) Mitigation measures or alternatives previously found not to be feasible would in fact be feasible and would substantially reduce one or more significant effects of the project; and, (D) Mitigation measures or alternatives which are considerably different from those analyzed in the previous negative declaration, would substantially reduce one or more significant effects on the environment.*

<p><i>Finding</i> <i>(3):</i></p>	<p>No new information of substantial importance, which was not known and could not have been known with the exercise of reasonable diligence at the time the previous environmental determination was adopted, has become available.</p> <p>The proposed project changes will not result in new significant environmental effects, or increase the severity of previously identified significant effects.</p>
