



The short documentary Our Lives: Surviving the Streets of Fresno shares both the unique stories and the varied opinions of ten individuals directly affected by homelessness in Fresno, California. Some were long-time residents of encampments and are now living at Dakota EcoGarden, others stay at the "Pov" or Mission. One man simply sleeps "over by the tracks."

Bonus features include the panel discussions with individuals featured in the film, from two public screenings which occurred on April 10, 2015 at Unitarian Universalist Church of Fresno and April 14, 2015 at Community Media Access Collaborative.
