## World Championship Competitors: Duncan Dynamics Robotics, Team 3970

- WHEREAS, Duncan Dynamic Robotics earned finalist awards at the two regional competitions and a wild card invitation to the FIRST FRC Championships in Houston, Texas. Their performance during the championships led them to be chosen as the first robot pick by Alliance 8 in the Galileo Division, where they were defeated in the quarter finals by the eventual world champion Alliance 1; and
- WHEREAS, The Duncan Dynamics robotics team offers students practical experience using tools, equipment, programming, and computer-aided design to prepare them for post-secondary experiences and careers; and
- WHEREAS, Duncan Polytechnical High School is a magnet school open to all students within Fresno Unified and surrounding school districts. Every Duncan student takes 4 years of career technical education courses in addition to their academic courses, so they are eligible and ready to take on post-secondary opportunities or move into high-skill, high-demand careers upon graduation; and
- WHEREAS, This year, the Duncan Dynamics Robotics team dedicated more than 2,300 hours outside of the school day designing, building, testing, redesigning, and validating their robot design for competition. Many students logged more than 300 hours after school during the 4-month build season; and
- WHEREAS, The Duncan Dynamics team members include: Robert Capps, Toby Ens, Kayla Her, Alex Lee, Xavier Romero, Ryan Rosas, Stephan Padilla, Kethan Souvannarath, George Vang, David Wells, Ethan Yang, Yinggi Yang. Their team is grateful to their mentors, 5 of whom are returning Duncan alumni and their teacher advisor, Douglas Urabe. The mentors invested over 1,400 hours in their students this season; and
- **WHEREAS,** All students on the team are in Duncan's Innovative Design and Applied Technology Academy and range from grades 9 through 12. This was the first time many of these students participated in a robotics competition.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Mayor and Fresno City Council, do hereby commend the Duncan Dynamics Robotics team on their performance.
