THE PROJECT DESCRIBED HEREIN IS DETEMINED TO BE CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE PREPARATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 19 OF THE STATE CEQA GUIDELINES.

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PROJECT TITLE: Fresno-Clovis Regional Wastewater Reclamation

Facility Raw Sewage Pump Repair

PROJECT LOCATIONS: Fresno-Clovis Regional Wastewater Reclamation Facility

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Repair, re-installation, and commissioning of a rebuilt

raw sewage pump located within the Fresno-Clovis Regional Wastewater Reclamation Facility (RWRF)

Headworks Building.

The Project is exempt under Section 15301/Class 1 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.

Under Section 15301/Class 1, projects are exempt from CEQA requirements when they consist of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use.

Specific examples identified in the Guidelines include:

- (b) Existing facilities of both investor and publicly-owned utilities used to provide electric power, natural gas, sewerage, or other public utility services;
- (d) Restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety, unless it is determined that the damage was substantial and resulted from an environmental hazard such as earthquake, landslide, or flood;

The Project described herein represents the repair, re-installation, and commissioning of an existing raw sewage pump in the RWRF Headworks Building that has broken down and is currently inoperable. The mechanical equipment is part of publicly-owned wastewater reclamation facility that requires rehabilitation to meet safe operating standards. The Project will not expand the use of the existing facility, nor will it relocate any existing mechanical equipment.

None of the exceptions to Categorical Exemptions set forth in the CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2, apply:

(a) Location The Project is not located in a sensitive environment or an environmental resource of hazardous or critical

concern as designated by federal, state, or local agencies. The work is entirely located at the RWRF.

(b) Cumulative Impact The Project will not have a cumulative negative

impact over time that is significant. The Project merely entails repair, re-installation, and commissioning of an existing raw sewage pump at

the RWRF.

(c) Significant Effect The Project will not have a significant effect on the

environment due to unusual circumstances. All work will be limited to an existing facility at the RWRF.

(d) Scenic Highways The Project will not result in damage to scenic

resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway. The Project is not located near

scenic highways.

(e) Hazardous Waste Sites The Project is not located on a hazardous waste site

which is included on any list compiled pursuant to

Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

(f) Historical Resources The Project will not cause a substantial adverse

change in the significance of a historical resource. The existing facilities at the RWRF are not

considered historical resources.

Furthermore, the proposed project is not expected to have a significant effect on the environment. Accordingly, a categorical exemption, as noted above, has been prepared for the project.
