Community Survey Feedback on American Rescue Plan Spending

Priorities


The City of Fresno will receive \$170 million from the federal government to address the impacts and recovery from COVID-19. The funding is derived from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) and can be invested or used generally in four areas: Public Health/Economic Recovery, Public Sector Revenue Loss, Essential Workers, and Infrastructure.

On December 2, 2021, the city of Fresno released an online anonymous, six minute, 10-question survey in English, Hmong, Spanish and Punjabi via Survey Monkey. The survey was distributed via City of Fresno media channels, community organizations and major media outlets. The purpose of the survey was to collect input from the community on their suggested spending priorities. Questions allowed respondents the opportunity to provide feedback on general spending priorities, specific spending priorities, and allowed for open ended feedback. Additional questions allowed respondents the chance to provide demographic input including, age, income, race, council district residency, etc.

As of December 8, 2021, at 12:00pm (PST) we received 780 completed surveys. After filtering out respondents who do not reside in the City of Fresno, there were 693 completed surveys. The following is an overall summary of the results. Findings are based on top 'two box' methodology.

Survey Findings

General Spending: In Question 1 we asked for respondents to "provide us your general preferences for City investment of ARPA funding by ranking the following categories. (1 = Most Preferred, 5 = Least Preferred" in the following categories.



Question 1 finding: In terms of general preference, survey respondents desire for ARPA spending to be used in "Response to public health emergency including public health, public safety (police and fire), and housing insecurity." (66% marked this as either a '1' or '2' spending priority). (For full breakdown see Appendix chart 1)

Specific Spending: In Question 2 we asked that respondents "provide us your specific preferences for City investment of ARPA funding by ranking the following categories. (1 = Most Preferred, 6 = Least Preferred):" in the following areas.

Economic Revitalization: provide assistance to small businesses who suffered under COVID-19



Question 2 Finding: In terms of specific preferences, survey respondents desire for ARPA spending to be used for "Homelessness: Services to address homelessness, such as buying motels to create more shelter beds, building supportive housing and using innovative new approaches to create much more affordable housing in Fresno." (46% marked this as either a '1' or '2' spending priority).

The aforementioned spending priority is tied with a preferred use of funds for "Public Safety: Expanding 911 Dispatch Center to reduce 911 hold times. Provide new vehicles, equipment and technology to our police officers and firefighters to keep the public safe." (46% marked this as either a '1' or '2' spending priority) (for full breakdown see Appendix chart 2)

Open-ended Spending: In Question 3 we asked that respondents to "Please provide any other feedback or input you would like to share."

Question 3 Finding: Open ended responses varied from focusing on public health, streets, homelessness, crime etc. (for full breakdown see Appendix chart 3)
