I'm concerned about our vulnerable that I have observed while doing outreach and giving rides to unhoused people to the warming center.

The week it was open because of freezing weather, I have a ride to a man who said his tent and belongings were thrown out by the police. He was away from his stuff and it was gone. He was left without protection while temperatures were in the 30s. This shouldn't happen. He had no option for shelter.

As well, we had so many people who were desperate and grateful for the few days we brought them to the warming center, both because they can escape the cold but also because they had a place to go and it was heartbreaking whenever it closed again because people had to find another place to sleep. There was no shelter available to them and they want shelter. Many were elderly and/or disabled. They have nearly nothing, hardly a blanket. We need options for them. Thank you
