Dear Fresno City Council Members and Mayor Dyer:

1. Please allocate funds in the Fresno budget for Safe Parking Lots' Programs, like San Jose, Ca's program, Mountain View, Ca's (in Santa Clara County), and the original program started by Santa Barbara, CA.

These can be viewed on YouTube videos.

2. Please ask religious groups, other non-profits, and businesses for parking lot spaces.

Please provide portable bathrooms, showers, laundry services, water, security, case management, and wifi.

3. There are many homeless families, singles, and couples who have had a destabilizing event and have no housing, such as being unable to afford housing, having a medical problem, job loss, small pension, and the years long wait list for affordable housing.

They are also law-abiding. They need a safe place to sleep and basic services.

They do not wish to be in gang-infested dangerous Fresno shelters. It is too stressful given their other stressors.

4. Please allocate funds in the Fresno budget for cargo container apartments like Life Moves in Mountain View, CA (Santa Clara County, CA) homeless transition shelters.

They can be built in four months. They are up to code. They come in family size, with bunk beds and a bathroom and shower in the family unit.

The cargo containers also come in single size. There are portable, non-congregate bathrooms with showers. Clients punch in their door code to use a bathroom and shower.

Laundry services are also provided.

These videos of the project can be viewed by LifeMoves on YouTube.

5. Professional Yearly Audits

Please allocate funds for professional yearly audits of all of Fresno, Ca's homeless shelters and services that receive government funds.

Please require that all providers undergo a modicum of yearly continuing education and medical training.

It is also important that the system undergo medical audits, since the basis of many homeless problems are medical.

In my experience as a law-abiding former paralegal, A's college, no: drugs, drink, crimes, changed CA law for high-risk crime victims (Safe at Home, admin by CA Sec of State), rendered homeless in my car due to problems from life-long epilepsy and a 3-20 yr battle with Social Security to get disability payments, with rejections, having to get attorneys to appeal at the federal level, the entire system is a disaster and is intentionally designed to destabilize sick people, and thus out communities.

A man on Twitter wrote me from London, England, that what I describe in California and the US is unlawful in England. He said that medically disabled people can't be discharged from the hospital until they are provided with: disability income, safe housing, and support services. It is a fast system in many European counties.

In the US, which chooses not to promptly stabilize people and pay front end costs, we pay billions in back-end costs: hospitalizations for acute medical problems, first responders, criminal justice, and on and on.

We saved precisely ZERO by not stabilizing people. It costs less to put them on disability income, or some kind of income, house them, and provide them with support services than it does to pay these billion dollar hidden back-end costs.

East Coast attorney Emily A. Benefer has written that, "Housing is health.' that is so true.

I've never had hospitalizations before my four year stint in my car as a homeless epileptic. I now enter my 5th year of homelessness, at age 60, no safe housing in site.

The government has paid more than \$800,000 for my hospitalizations.

It would have been far cheaper to promptly provide me with disability income, safe housing, and support services.

The government saved \$0 on being cheapskates with me, and others.

The current system is designed for failure. It's like asking someone who has been in a car crash to climb Mt. Everest. Few will ever make it. And that seems quite intentional government. Can any of them do math? Can they do cost/benefit analysis?

5. There is a growing number of homeless seniors in cars in Fresno, CA, unable to afford apartments on tiny Social Security checks.

This is a tragedy.

6. Fresno needs to copy LifeMoves excellent homeless services in Santa Clara County, CA, and the Mid-Peninsula Housing Foundation's excellent low-income, classy apartment buildings.

All of this can be seen online. Fresno should copy these "best practices".

7. Finally, the Fresno city budget should provide mobile vans with medical care, coffee, tshirts, socks, water, athletes' cream, and other basics.

We need a grid system of the city, and to perhaps work with UCSF Fresno, St. Agnes Hospital, etc and build rapport and trust with homeless folks.

It goes a long ways.

The Lutherans at Hope Lutheran Church, corner of Fresno and Barstow Sts, Fresno, CA, have provided me with Tshirt/hygeine packs to give to homeless folks. The Lutherans applied for grants to do this.

8. Many of our homeless folks were victims of felonious child abuse and they have no support network to help properly launch them into adulthood.

Others of our homeless have defective genes that cause schizophrenia. I pray for cures to this. Until then, they are still human beings.

We treat lost dogs better than many of them.

Dear council,

There are a lot of asks that we brought forth as a community and I hope you will reconsider these in making and voting on your motions.

I want to uplift the demands of our collective group of community organizations and members <u>here</u> and the demands of CNC Ed Fund's Park Advocates United <u>here</u>

Thank you Tyler, for motioning for the \$300 youth voucher program As a former recreation department leader, I know how important it is. Thank you for many of your motions, including the many specific parks improvement, Chavez' funding toward legal defense for immigrants, Arias' motion for wi-fi on buses, Maxwell's motion towards funding a climate plan, Chavez' motions ADA and safety plans with transportation, Arias' motion on food vendor safety, the multiple economic development motions, and Mazwell's motion to use money to engage hard-to-reach communities among many.

I have several other clarified asks and a few to repeat:

- I ask for funding for mental health first aid training for all those who have contact with the
 unhoused community. This was requested by an unhoused
 member: https://www.mentalhealthfirstaid.org/
- I ask for funding towards comprehensive services, such as an increase in case workers and mental health resources and paid mental health professionals at all of the shelters.
- I ask for funding of a mental health professional to be added to HART. I will continue to demand that the PD be taken out of HART as unnecessary and for trained professionals to instead assist.
- I ask for funding for accommodations for pets, such as kennels at all community centers so that all people can access the community centers for cooling and warming
- I ask for rides to the community center be free for anyone during open hours, even beyond cooling and warming center open times, so that people can access these both as a respite from the weather, but also to create greater access to other community center resources.
- I ask for a special fund for cooling and warming center resources, such as blankets (they ran
 out during the warming center, but I understand that this was an unexpected accommodation
 to be open for a month), food, staffing, especially for an employee trained and able to assist
 those who need help accessing restrooms (people couldn't go to the warming center if they
 couldn't go to the bathrooms themselves), a van for staff to do pick ups of those who have
 mobility issues.
- I ask for water stations to be installed outside city buildings and such to allow for access to water, especially during hot months.
- I request for the Parks Ranger program to be its own department. Just as national parks and other programs have their own department. If not, I ask that it be in the Parks department and

that there would be funding to be trained by those in the national forest service or other such program.

I also ask that the Mental Health Triage/ Response program be in its own department, as it

works alongside but isn't the police.

• I ask that the Advance Peace not only be eligible, but be continued, as it was already a program the city had in its previous budget

I ask that SROs not be funded, as it is not an effective use of resources. I will email the council

about this separately

• I ask for enough of affordable housing projects to be reserved for all those in the shelters to ensure that people have a place to go from the shelters. I know of one person that I saw go into the shelters last year, who got a job and did everything she was asked to do and she was exited without housing because of longevity.

I ask for money towards a comprehensive effort to improve community outreach and engagement so that more of the community will know about and engage in opportunities to

speak up (and you all won't keep hearing just from the same people).

- I ask for the Office of Community Relations to be restored. As well, I ask that this include an office for the unhoused community and include building a commission for those with lived experience, both the recently housed and the currently unhoused, so that a dedicated office can work on how to engage the unhoused community (which is a requirement of the Annual Action Plan). I also ask for a LGBTQ relations office be added.
- I have been hearing from community members on Reddit and echo their ask for more senior centers.
- I ask for funding towards sanitation for those who are unhoused, including dumpsters in key locations and bathrooms.
- I ask for a program to help those who unhoused or in poverty assistance with vehicle registration.
- I ask for safe lots, such as a RV/ Car park, as well as tent dwelling for those who can't access the shelters.
- I ask for funding for a jobs program for the unhoused community as this is something I hear constantly: people want jobs. This should include assistance with job preparedness, clothing, wi-fi access at shelters, partnerships with companies that will train and/or hire those who are unhoused, places to store belongings during the day, etc.

comment on Advance Peace

Dear Mr. Todd Stermer,

I consider myself a well educated resident of Fresno having attending UC San Diego for college and UC Davis Medical School for my MD. I want to say how difficult it is to use your current system to make comments to the City Council on particular agenda items or to make e-comments on agenda items.

I attended the June 20, 2022 budget hearings via Zoom. I spoke in favor of the City Council returning the funding that the Mayor's proposed budget has taken away from Advance Peace. There was a motion made to continue funding Advance Peace. I wanted to comment on the motion before the deadline of 900 AM, June 22, 2022. I could not find a way to comment.

Below is my 289 word comment with the hope you will be able to put the comment in the proper place in the meeting agenda:

Since 2018, I have supported Advance Peace in Fresno. I am asking that the City Council reinstate funding for Advance Peace Fresno. After having seen the presentation to the City Council Budget Hearing on June 20, 2022, which clearly showed evidence that Advance Peace has had a positive economic and social benefit for Fresno by decreasing gun homicides and gun violence.

Researchers with U.C. Berkeley Department of Public Health found that in the second half of 2021, Advance Peace Fresno's 17 fellows interrupted 60 imminent gun violence conflicts; responded to 21

shootings to prevent retaliatory violence; and mediated 200 community conflicts that could have escalated to gun violence.

Defunding Advance Peace and then having the Mayor's office or the Police Department develop a similar program, that may not even be as beneficial, is overcompensating for a mistake. I am aware of the concern regarding the one member of Advance Peace who was arrested in April 2022. He may have been pulled back into the gang life or at the least made bad decisions and recommendations to men he was supposed to mentor.

Even so, I do not think the error that one man may have made warrants throwing out a program that has been shown to be effective in decreasing gun violence in Fresno. Even Mayor Dyer ended his June 20, 2022, presentation by saying "I know for a fact, they've stopped shootings." In so doing, Advance Peace has saved lives.

The researcher from U.C. Berkeley Department of Public Health said one homicide costs the City of Fresno \$1.2 million. That does not speak the immeasurable loss the families feel when one them is killed by gun violence. At this time it is worthwhile for the City Council to reinstate the funding of Advance Peace.

Dear Fresno City Councilmembers & Mayor Jerry Dyer,

I am writing to ask you to adopt all the budget requests made by CNC Education Fund's Parks Advocates United Committee.

These requests include:

Invest \$300,000 to institute a Youth Activities Fee Waiver Voucher Program.

Place the new Parks Ranger program in the PARCS Department not the Police Department. Invest funds to renovate Quigley Park.

Invest \$5,000,000 to fund a Participatory Budgeting Process.

Invest \$75,000 to conduct a Representative Sample Survey to measure community needs.

Increase the PARCS special events fund from \$2,000 to \$10,000 per park site per year.

Lease the Bitwise Hive for the PARCS Department to run indoor sports like futsal, basketball, volleyball, and roller derby.

Invest in making specific improvements at Lafayette, Lions, Maxie L Parks, Cary, and El Dorado parks that will increase multi-use enjoyment and make much needed repairs.

Investments to improve all our City of Fresno soccer fields, playgrounds, and identify opportunities to include the roller skating and skateboarding communities.

Renovate low use tennis courts to multi-use futsal, volleyball, junior tennis, and turf soccer mini soccer courts.

These investments will directly support my neighborhood, my family, and myself. These improvements would fix some of the issues in the neighborhood parks my loved ones enjoy and would offer a wider variety of ways to enjoy Fresno parks.

I support these recommendations because they meet the expectations for how Measure P funds would significantly improve access to and enjoyment of our green spaces.

Please invest in the future of Fresno, and adopt all the budget requests made by the CNC Education Fund's Parks Advocates United Committee on behalf of Fresno residents.
