








Homeless Funding by Grant Source since 2019








Recent History of Homelessness in the Fresno/Madera Community




Homelessness in Fresno 2020 vs 2022




Housing Inventory in Fresno/Madera Community




Fresno/Madera Region Homeless Housing Inventory






