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A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, TO FUND THE FRESNO MIXED-INCOME NEIGHBORHOOD TRUST

WHEREAS, the City of Fresno (City) expressed an interest in ensuring residents have access to safe and habitable housing; and

WHEREAS, the City's most recent federal Annual Performance Report on Housing showed severe underproduction of homes for low-income families; and

WHEREAS, public and philanthropic funding to subsidize affordable housing is scarce and insufficient to meet the City's needs; and

WHEREAS, the Lowell Community Development Corporation (LCDC) and Trust Neighborhoods (TN) have co-sponsored the creation of a Mixed-Income Neighborhood Trust (MINT) in Central Fresno; and

WHEREAS, a MINT aims to develop, own, and operate mixed-income rental properties throughout a neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, MINTs create long-term, quality affordable rental housing, with the goals to: give the community more control over real estate development; preserve affordable rents in perpetuity to protect renters at risk of displacement; offer high quality rental units as an alternative to negligent landlords; and allow residents to stay in these communities as they change and grow; and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2022, the City unveiled its One Fresno Housing Strategy which outlined 47 priorities to address Fresno's three-year housing needs; and

WHEREAS, one of the 47 recommendations contained within the One Fresno

Housing Strategy placed priority on partnering with a MINT by way of a one-time allocation of American Rescue Plan Act funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fresno as follows:

- 1. Central Fresno Mixed-Income Neighborhood Trust shall be funded with a one-time allocation in the amount of \$2,000,000, subject to a future funding agreement approved by council, from the City's American Rescue Plan Funds to:
  - a. Acquire and rehabilitate a minimum of 50 units of rental housing;
  - b. Hold title to these units in the Central Fresno Neighborhood Trust;
  - c. Rent these units to low-income residents who earn 80% of annual median income or less; and
    - d. Provide affordable housing for no fewer than 55 years.
  - 2. This resolution is subject to all City rules and regulations.
  - 3. This resolution shall be effective upon final approval.
