

## FY 2023 Accomplishments General City Purpose Department

- \$2,964,500 final debt service payment for the No Neighborhood Left Behind Program.
- \$9,500,000 pass-through funding from the State to outside organizations

Retirement Office implemented critical changes in financial reporting to meet requirements

- Retirement Systems are poised to continue to meet assumed rate of return over a full market cycle
- 8,595 animals have entered the City of Fresno Animal Center as of May 1, 2022
- Total Live release rate is projected to be 84 percent, an increase of 26 percent over CY
- Over 700 animals were vaccinated at the first free vaccine clinic.

## Notes

- Personnel expenditures primarily correspond to the Retirement Internal Service and Employee Separation funds.
- FY 2024 Personnel budget includes \$32.3 million projected vacancy savings per 10% attrition rate.
- Non-Personnel expenditures mainly correspond to debt service payments along with expenditures not specific to a department.
- Interdepartmental expenditures decline from the FY 2023 Amended Budget to FY 2024 Proposed primarily due to FY 2023 one-time Fleet fuel reserve.

## Notes

- Two Community Coordinator positions were established in FY 2023 under the Animal Control Division per City Council's approval of the 4<sup>th</sup> PAR Amendment. These two positions assist with the Program's public relations efforts.
- 2 A Retirement Counselor I/II and Senior Customer Services Clerk were each established in the FY 2023 Adopted Budget at 0.75 FTE. These two positions are budgeted each at 1.0 FTE in FY 2024, which accounts for the 0.50 FTE change.

- Contractual Obligations DS payments for:
- \$16,194,800: Pension Oblig. Bonds. Scheduled to sunset in FY 2029.
- \$2,680,000: Various capital facilities & Convention Center Garage. Scheduled to sunset in FY 2035.
- \$2,369,500: Bee Bldg. / Granite Park bonds Scheduled to sunset in FY 2031.
- \$2,208,000: City Hall Chiller. Final payment in FY 2024.
- \$1,124,100: Animal Shelter Bonds. Sunset in FY 2046.
- \$6,741,400 total Animal Control Budget (including \$183,100 personnel costs).
- Outside Legal Services budgeted in line with FY 2023 expenditure trend.
