Good Morning-

My name is Raquel M. Busani. I am a local attorney, and presently serve on the Board of Directors for Fresno Metropolitan Flood Control District as a City of Fresno appointee and am also Director of Programming for the Fresno Reel Pride LGBTQ+ Film Festival.

I write today to (1) support the creation of an LGBTQIA community liaison position in the mayors office; and (2) to oppose the sit, lie, sleep ordinance—two issues that are not only dear to my heart, but that I believe will determine the future of Fresno.

LGBTQIA Community Liaison: Support

First, I write in support of the LGBTQIA community liaison in the mayor's office. This should not however simply be a symbolic position. While symbols and ceremony are appreciated and even necessary, they stop being calls to action when, as it seems to be the case here, action never happens. Three years ago when the City of Fresno for the first time raised the Pride flag, Mayor Dyer vowed to accompany this gesture with the appointment of an LGBTQIA community liaison officer, but has yet to come through. Of course, these things take time, but they also take effort—and that effort has not been put in since the Mayor's initial announcement. It is no surprise that it has taken the election and swearing in of the City's first openly queer City Counsel member to restart this conversation. All the more reason why this position is so important. Ms. Perea, while openly queer, was not voted in as a representative of the LGBTQIA community, and therefore, while I have no doubt that she will champion its causes, her duty is to her constituents—most of which are not members of the LGBTQIA community, and some of which may altogether be antagonistic to the community.

It is unfortunately, because of the antagonism that still exists against the LGBTQIA community, why an LGBTQIA liaison is necessary. However, as stated, the position must be more than symbolic, and the person appointed would be expected by the community to:

- Advocate for policies and practices that make every department (police, transportation, planning, parks, etc.) in the City of Fresno a safer place for LGBTQ+ individuals.
- Form and/or oversee an LGBTQ+ community advisory group that represents the diversity of the LGBTQ+ community and its multiple identities and districts
- Represent the needs and desires of the Fresno LGBTQ+ community directly with the Mayor and each city-wide department
- Be a point of contact for LGBTQ+ community members who might not feel safe to reach out directly to city officials.

This ordinance is not only badly thought out, but it is cruel and a continued sign of the City's disregard for those at the bottom. Please vote to oppose this senseless and dangerous ordinance.

Conclusion

This approach to ban homeless from occupying sidewalks and other public areas does nothing to relieve homelessness or to solve the problem of safe access to buildings. Instead, it simply heaps more criminalization on a group of the public which has been failed by every single public service.

These types of restrictions, rather than solutions to problems, simply increase, not only the trauma to the victims, but the workload of the enforcers. It defies the logic of community policing, and it treats people in most cases who do not have the mental and physical health to manage their own Location. You are simply pushing people into the landscaping and the bushes around the city. City has received millions and millions of dollars to provide real solutions for the problems. We face with homelessness in Fresno. We know that homelessness has been increasing due to low wages, expensive and very small, housing inventory. If the City of Fresno would take seriously an approach to solving those problems by providing a raise in minimum wage to \$18 an hour and two single payer healthcare, we would solve this problem quickly. Rather than spend those funds on bitwise and garlic festivals. We should be spending the money on addressing the needs of the unhoused Community.

If the City of Fresno really wants to improve the business culture attracting clean businesses, rather than the constant influx of polluting businesses, we need to address these concerns, and we need to drip dramatically demonstrate that we are not San Francisco or Oakland or San Jose. We care and we can solve these in ways that they are not.

I urge you to vote against this measure today.

First, we would like to extend our gratitude to bring together the LGBTQ+ Local Leaders Roundtable on June 6, 2023. Having an open dialogue with members from across the community is needed now more than ever as the LGBTQ+ community is continuously attacked, silenced and are being historically and systematically erased from our nation's history, as well as denied basic and fundamental rights that are afforded to others.

As such, a cohort of leaders in attendance expressed concern regarding the appointment of an LGBTQ+ Community Liaison within the City of Fresno's Mayor's Office of Community Affairs. The methodology in which other organizers who were present, including the petition of approximately 400 signatures - albeit a great start - is not reflective of the community as a whole. In addition, there is a lack of transparency and community input to define the prospective appointees role, scope of work, and representation on behalf of the City and community. There is also concern the new liaison would be selected and appointed in an unfair or biased process. Lastly, in regards to the established "task force," we feel there is a lack of clarity with respect to the scope of work and composition of the task force, which more input is needed to establish.

In the spirit of solidarity and community representation, we should continue to work together to fully define the recommended proposals to include the following:

- 1. Holding community meetings to garner feedback on the role and responsibilities of the LGBTQ+ Task Force or Commission and LGBTQ+ Liaison within the City of Fresno;
- 2. Upon securing funding in the upcoming 2023-24 budget, establish an 11 member LGBTQ+ Task Force or Commission to help advise the Fresno City Council on the needs and concerns of the LGBTQ+ community of all races, religions, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, among others. Members would be comprised of appointees from all seven (7) Council districts along with two (2) members identified and appointed from Fresno youth-serving organizations, one (1) member identified and appointed from a local community-based organization, and one (1) at-large member appointed by the Mayor's office. Should a Councilmember be unable to identify an appointment, or choose not to participate, that appointment would be an additional at-large member appointed by the District 1 councilmember or Mayor's office. Members should be over the age of 18 at time of the appointment, and each member will be confirmed by a majority vote of the Council.

Subject: Proposed FY 23/24 Permanent Pickleball Court Projects

I am writing this statement to the Fresno City Council to implore the Council to continue progress toward permanent pickleball court projects initially included in the FY 23 Budget.

I represent Fresno Area Pickleball (FAP) a private nonprofit organization with over 1,500 MeetUp site picklball players in the Fresno Area with play at 3 parks seven days per week.

The PARCS own public outreach survey of the Fresno citizens dated February 7, 2022 showed the high demand for pickleball courts in Fresno. Per Question 4: What recreation amenities/facilities are most needed in our parks". Pickleball courts rated 3rd out of 12 listed.

I have been participating in the Measure "P" Parks, Recreation, and Arts Commission since its inception. We are very excited that three sites, Rotary East Park, Vinland Park and Woodward Park were included in the FY23 Budget.

At the PRAC meeting last night, on June 23, 2023, one of the Commissioners put forth a motion that all park site courts shall be multi-use facilities. The Commissioner specifically identified the Vinland Park, Rotary East Park and Roeding Park project courts should be "multi-use with as many as five sets of different game lines! The Commissioner convinced enough Commissioners to support this policy and include it at as an addition to the PRAC recommendation to the Fresno City Council and that it be applied to the existing projects!

I was participating through Zoom and raised my hand to comment about why this was not practicable for pickleball courts. Unfortunately motion occurred at the very end of the meeting and I was not recognized after this unfortunate and unrealistic motion was approved.

While in some instances multi-use can be done. In fact FAP did not oppose tennis, pickleball and volleyball striping for the current resurfacing project at Vinland Park that is scheduled to begin on June 12th. Pickleball with permanent courts, fences and gates do not lend themselves to multi-use structure. Fresno Area Pickleball has been seeking permanent picklball courts so Fresno players and families in can play the game anytime they want rather than only when FAP is on site and providing the court net systems and supplies.


The environmental and design phase work for these pickleball court projects have already been funded, advertised, contractor selected, and is waiting your approval later this week. If the characteristics of the projects change the process will need to be started all over again.

Fresno Area Pickleball requests that the Fresno City Council continue the current permanent pickleball projects as envisioned by FAP and City PARCS.

Other General Pickleball Facts

- 1. Per the USAPA, Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the United States and has been for the past ten years. Estimate is over 39 million players in USA.
- 2. Fresno Area Pickleball Inc. bylaws specify seeking installation of permanent pickleball courts in Fresno as one of its primary objectives.
- 3. There are no permanent pickleball courts in any of the 100+ parks in Fresno.
- 4. Currently, there are permanent pickleball courts already installed in Fowler, Selma, Visalia, Hanford, and Bakersfield. <u>I think none of them have multi-use striping lines on them.</u>
- 5. Permanent pickleball courts will provide an advanced service to Fresno citizens. Citizens can play anytime the parks are open rather than having to be constrained by playing only when FAP has its manual temporary net systems set up for open play.
- 6. Pickleball is a healthy activity for everyone. It can be played by families, children, seniors.
- 7. Fresno Area Pickleball provides beginner classes for anyone who wishes to learn the rules and strategy.
- 8. Four court pickleball sites typically draw 25 -35 players while the 8 court site has 50+ players.

Fresho City Council members are going to unlawfully enforce a citywide web of local laws that impose criminal penalties on people experiencing unsheltered homelessness when they sleep, sit, lie down, and rest in public. This ordinance would directly violate the Fourth, Eighth, and Fourteenth Amendments of the United States Constitution and California civil rights laws.

The Fourth Amendment, protects people from unreasonable searches and seizures by the government which this ordinance would do. It would violate the Eighth Amendment: "Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted." and the The Fourteenth Amendment prohibits the states from depriving any person of "life, liberty, or property" without fair treatment under the law.

Further, there are court cases which mark precedent against an ordinance like this. Martin Vs Boise states, no city shall be allowed to criminalize any individual IF a shelter bed is NOT available. If Fresno city passes this on June 8th 2023, we will be allowing them to criminalize thousands of people experiencing homelessness today on the streets of Fresno CA. Not to mention any violation of rights can be taken to court and monetary damages can be asked for. This money will only come out of the pockets of our tax payers and not out the pockets of the people who created this "Death Notice Ordinance"

Kincaid vs City of Fresno states that the city employees are not allowed to toss out personal property and must store property at city storage on H street.

If this passes, we will be banning thousands of people 500 feet from schools, daycares, libraries, homeless navigation centers, warming centers and cooling centers. In Fresno we have hundreds of these centers all over, so if you were to map out all the places no one can be within 500 feet, you will find that the only places the unhoused are not banned from will be residential & commercial properties only.

Fresno City does not have enough shelter beds for our unhoused individuals, unhoused families, substance abuse & Mental Health Services available for people wanting shelter who are experiencing homelessness in the City of Fresno. This is not the solution we need.
