***P3a. Description:** This full 2-story Tudor Revival style home faces south onto E. Huntington Blvd. The construction is wood frame with stucco cladding. The double cross-gabled steeply pitched roof has wide overhanging eaves, a simple fascia board trim and decorative wood knee braces. The roof on the west end-gabled bay swoops down on a diagonal to the first floor to connect with a wood trellis that extends across the façade from the front entrance to the east end of the home. Typical to the style is the non-structural decorative wood strapwork which is located under the roof peaks of the two end-gabled bays. The home's main entrance is off-center to the west on the façade. The single French door has 15 lights with wood muntins; the sidelights include 10 panes each. The west bay has double French doors of 10 lights each flanked by sidelights also of 10 lights. This assemblage of French doors and sidelights is replicated on the east bay. Two large windows on the first floor are located east of the front door and are separated into a sash of 12 lights above and 6 lights below. The windows on the façade's second story include 3/1 double hung sash and a ribbon window of 2/1 3/1 2/1 double hung sash on the west bay. Most windows have decorative shutters. A small piazza extends from the French doors on the west bay which is protected with a one story partial width porch covering which is supported by heavy piers. A tall external chimney is located on the west elevation; an internal chimney is located on the east side of the home. An end-gabled garage with decorative strapwork is situated at the northwest corner of the parcel.

This residence was built for Jenny and Ralph Watson in 1922 on lot 11 and lot 12 of Block 17 of the Alta Vista Tract (Building permit #1561). The tract was platted in 1911 as a streetcar suburb on either side of the Sunnyside and Recreation Line which had been extended circa 1907 by Jenny Watson's father, Albert Graves Wishon to carry Fresno residents out to Recreation Park (Garcia 2003). Albert Wishon purchased the first parcels in the new subdivision in 1912, a day after the official annexation, and he completed a beautiful Arts and Crafts inspired residence at the corner of Huntington Boulevard and Sixth Street in 1916. Block 17 was subdivided a few years later to allow first for the Watson residence and later for the corner parcel to accommodate the 1947 residence for Wishon's granddaughter, Eleanor Wishon MacMichael. The Watson home is an excellent example of the Tudor Revival, a style loosely based on a variety of Medieval English prototypes and which was popular in the Fresno area between the two World Wars. The Ralph and Jenny Watson Home appears to be eligible for Fresno's Local Register of Historic Resources under Criteria i, ii and iii as for its association with the Alta Vista Tract, the Wishon family and for its architectural significance. The home is also a contributor to the proposed Local Register Huntington Boulevard Historic District and a contributor to the NR eligible Alta Vista Tract.

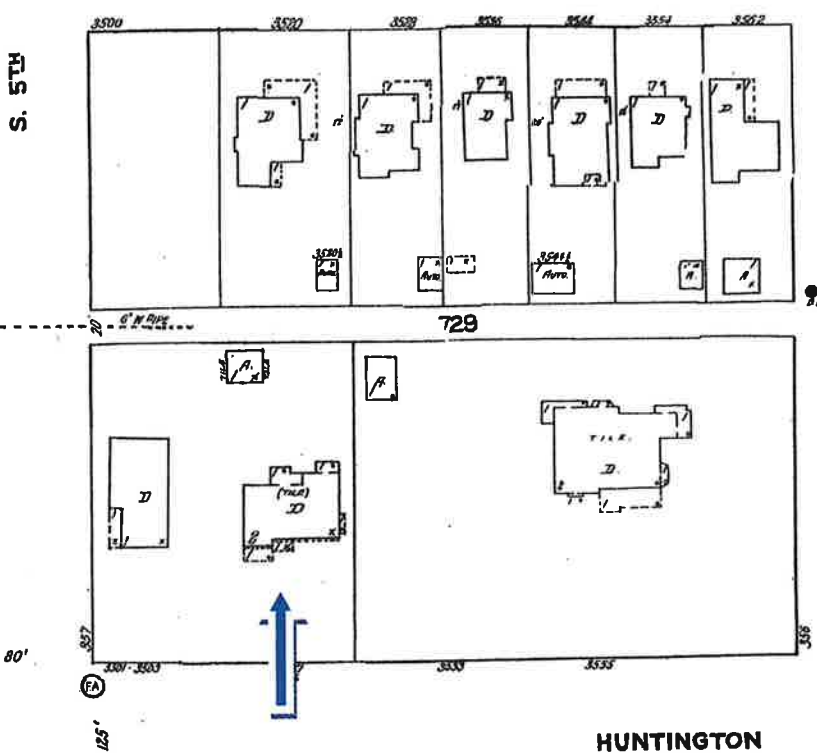

***P3a. Description:** This full two-story home is Tudor Revival in design and faces south onto E. Pine Avenue. The exterior has a smooth stucco cladding with decorative wood strapwork. The roof is steeply pitched hip with a projecting gable ended bay that has a cantilevered second story. In addition to the cantilevered bay an additional character defining feature of this particular home is a tall vertical diamond paned window that is articulated with decorative strapwork. This window also has a slight cantilever with an interesting tile vent underneath of it. It would appear that this window lights the staircase. The front door is offset and of wood with three vertical panes of glass in the upper half. The front door is protected by a sheet metal porch hood with a scalloped edge. Decorative quoins serve as a door surround. The windows on the façade are double hung sash with fixed transoms and appear to be new replacements. There is a small one story nook on the east elevation. A larger one story cross gabled extension is apparent from the aerial. There is no visible chimney from the street.

WHEREAS, the "Wilson Island" neighborhood of the Tower District was developed in 1908 as part of the Wilson's North Fresno Tract by Rosanna C. Wilson and her son A. Polette Wilson; and

WHEREAS, Wilson Island is a six-block neighborhood that is one of the most architecturally distinct in Fresno with a mix of styles prevalent during the period of 1910-1954; and

WHEREAS, the properties identified in Attachment "A" are proposed to be included as part of the proposed Wilson Island Historic District; and

WHEREAS, several of the homes were designed by prominent local and regional architects (and/or building firms) including Charles E. Butner, William D. Coates, Richard F. Felchlin, Swartz and Ryland, Taylor-Wheeler Builders, Manoog Manoogian, etc; and

WHEREAS, the Island was settled by many of Fresno's influential families with important ties to banking, education, architecture and commerce; and

WHEREAS, the Island retains integrity to its period of significance of 1910-1954 with 97.5 % of the homes eligible as contributors to the District, as the term "Contributor to a Local Historic District" is defined by Fresno Municipal Code, section 12-1603(g) ; and

WHEREAS, on October 29, 2009, the Council held a hearing where it considered the recommendation of the Historic Preservation Commission, and substantial evidence, including but not limited to, a staff presentation, a report prepared by staff addressing the properties eligibility to the Local Register, a Historic Property Survey Report ("HPSR"), a District Record ("DR") and a Primary Record ("PR") for each contributing property to the District prepared by the City's Historic Preservation Specialist (as defined in FMC § 12-1604(b)) finding that the proposed Wilson Island District falls within the definition of a Local Historic District, as set forth in Fresno Municipal Code, section 12-1603(s) as it met eligibility requirements for criteria 1, 2, 3 and 4 to subdivision 12-1607(b).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fresno:

1. Council finds that the above recitals are true and correct.
2. Council finds that the Wilson Island Historic District falls within the definition of Local Historic District set forth in Fresno Municipal Code, section 12-603(s), its designation is consented to by the majority of the property owners within the proposed District, at least fifty percent of the resources within the proposed District are fifty years of age or older, and is eligible for listing under criteria 1, 2, 3 and 4f subdivision 12-1607(b) based upon the evidence presented to Council in the staff presentation, staff report, the HPSR, DR and the PRs.



3. Council designates Wilson Island as a Local Historic District to be listed on the Local Register of Historic Resources.
4. Council finds that all of the properties identified in Attachment A are contributors to the Wilson Island Historic District except for the following: 607 E. Floradora Avenue and 621 E. Floradora Avenue.

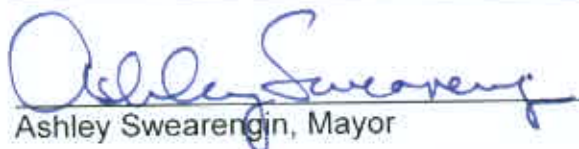
