RE: SUPPORT Brenntag Proposed Plan

Dear Mr. Brandau.

I write to respectfully request your support for Brenntag's plan to build a 50,000 square-foot warehouse which would store chemicals used primarily for agriculture.

Brenntag is an international chemical storage company that has been in business for over a hundred years. The company has enjoyed a stellar reputation for the last 30 years at its current location in Malaga, but has simply outgrown the facility. Brenntag wants to invest in Fresno, a city that begs for job creation, by building a new, larger facility and hiring more employees. The company offers paid sick and vacation time as well as 401K plans for every employee and most jobs don't require a college degree.

The Chamber's Government Affairs Council met with the builder, McCall Oil, and opponents of the project twice and ultimately felt that the \$9 million building investment, additional dozen good-paying, full-time jobs, and local construction crews slated to build the facility would be tremendous assets to the community. The Chamber expressed its views to members of the Planning Commission with a formal letter, reached out individually to most commissioners, and spoke publicly during the meeting on June 18th.

Unfortunately, with only four commissioners present, the 2-2 vote resulted in a technical rejection. It appears two commissioners were swayed by opponents who cited a very long history of poor planning in Southwest Fresno, not specific, proven concerns about how Brenntag may negatively impact the area.

The reality is that a solid business like Brenntag would greatly contribute financially to the city. Furthermore, the well-maintained building and nice landscaping would send a positive message to the community that Fresno is committed to revitalizing areas of need.

Brenntag has followed all the rules during this process and it doesn't seem fair that it would be denied the right to build a *light industrial* building on 11 acres of blighted property zoned *heavy industrial* near Hughes and Nielsen.

Fresno has a reputation for being unfriendly to business and unfortunately the recent decision by the planning commission is an example of exactly that. I hope that on August 28th, when the issue goes before council, you will rectify this poor decision and vote for growing our economy with job creation and new development instead of allowing another interested business fall through the cracks of our local government.
