These survey forms are attached.

The Azteca Theater is a 15,000 sf two story masonry constructed building which faces "west" onto F Street in Fresno's Chinatown. It was constructed in 1948 by Johnson and Moore Consulting Engineers (Ryan Johnson personal interview 14 Sepember 2015) for Gustavo A. Acosta who owned a small theater chain, including a burlesaue palace on F Street called the Cal Theater. Of interest is that there were at least two other motion picture theaters on F Street during the 1940s, the Lyceum and the Rex. (Gonzalez 2006 footnote; Sanborn Fire Insurance Map 1948). The theater was designed by the English-born architect, J.C. Johnson, who was never credentialed as an architect in the United States. Of some interest is that the elevation drawings originally submitted to the property owner were for a more ornate Spanish Revival

The Azteca Theater was previously evaluated and found individually eligible for both the California Register of Historical Resources and Fresno's Local Register of Historic Resources and as a contributor to a Local Register District in the City's 2006 Chinatown Historic Survey. The consultants, Architectural

style building but were changed to accommodate a more modest façade (See continuation sheet).

Resources Group (San Francisco), found the building eligible as a distinctive example of a type, thus Criterion 3/iii, the "single-screen neighborhood theater in the Art Deco style." For the Local District evaluation the Azteca was found to be a contributor under Criterion i for its "representation of the development of Fresno's Chinatown and a new phase of growth after World War II."

The consultants for the High Speed Rail Authority, (JRP Historical Consulting, 2011) concurred with the findings of the 2006 survey and also did not find the Azteca eligible for the National Register of Historic Resources. However neither survey included an evaluation of the building vis-a-vis its importance in the social history of Fresno's (and the San Joaquin Valley's) Latino community. Neither survey referenced the 2006 article by Manuel G. Gonzales Ph.D. in *California History*: "Arturo Tirado and the Teatro Azteca: Mexican Popular Culture in the Central San Joaquin Valley." Additionally, the architectural heritage of this simple Art Deco retro style theater deserves a deeper look.

The City of Fresno has been contracted by the California Office of Historic Presevation to prepare the National Register nomination for the Azteca as part of the state's *Latinos in Twentieth Century California* Multiple Property nomination. As the preparation of this nomination is currently in progress (September 2015) a few additional points will only be summarized at this time to support the theater's eligibility for the Local Register of Historic Resources. A fuller narrative will be fleshed out for the National Register documentation.

By the 1930s Fresno had the largest Mexican community in the San Joaquin Valley, with a resident population of 6,000 which grew to 10,000 each harvest (Gonzalez 2006:50). For this mostly poor immigrant community Spanish-language movies provided an important escape. Each weekend during the 1940s and 1950s working class Mexican families came into Fresno to attend dances, eat Chinese food and see a movie at the Azteca Theater. (The Art Deco retro façade of the theater with its stepped parapet and blade sign, "Azteca" undoubtedly connected with immigrants from Central Mexico.) The Azteca, under the management of Mexican-born Arturo Tirado, provided not only a steady source of films made during the Golden Age of Mexican cinema, but was a venue for personal appearances by many of the leading actors of Mexican film: Maria Felix, Agustin Lara, Pedro Armendariz, Antonio Aguilar and Pedro Infante (Gonzalez 2006:58).

Additionally, the Azteca Theater served as a community center for the Latino community. When in March 1966 Cesar Chavez led striking farmworkers on their march from Delano to Sacramento, they stopped in Fresno, met with Mayor Floyd Hyde at City Hall and held a rally in the Azteca which featured Chavez and the striking farmworkers. This rally on Thursday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, 1966 was attended by 1000 people (*Fresno Bee The Republican* 23, 24 and 25 March 1966).

Beyond his role as an entertainer and entrepreneur, Arturo Tirado was a leading figure in Fresno's Latino community earning the unofficial title, "mayor of West Fresno." He had a weekly program on Fresno's KNEX which provided a sounding board for issues of importance to the Valley's Mexican community. Tirado's relations with City officials, in fact, helped to ensure that Chavez and marchers were protected and welcomed when they arrived in Fresno.

In brief, the Azteca Theater appears to be individually eligible to Fresno's Local Register of Historic Resources under Criterion i (for its role in West Fresno/Latino community life), for its association with Arturo Tirado, who operated the Azteca from 1956-1980 (Criterion ii); and as an example of a modest but forthright example of Art Deco retro (Criterion iii).


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

\*B10. Significance: J. Stock and L. MacDonald of Architectural Resources Group inventoried and evaluated this property in 2006 for the "Chinatown Historic Resources Survey" produced for the City of Fresno Planning and Development Department (see attached). They concluded that the property did not appear to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP); however, they concluded that it appeared eligible for listing in the California Register of Historic Resources (CRHR) under Criterion 3, as well as Fresno's local register under Criteria "iii" for its distinctive characteristics as a single-screen neighborhood theater in the Art Deco style. Their evaluation also concluded that the property is eligible as a contributor to a potential historic district under Fresno Criterion "i" for its association with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history, specifically the history of Fresno's Chinatown. After review of the previous recordation and current field check, the present evaluation and concurs with the 2006 conclusions and the integrity remains intact.

This property has been evaluated in accordance with Section 15064.5(a)(2)-(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, using the criteria outlined in Section 5024.1 of the California Public Resources Code. This property does not appear to meet the eligibility criteria for listing in the NRHP, but is eligible for the CRHR and local listing, and is an historical resource for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The boundary of the historical resource is its legal parcel.
