- ADA is a <u>civil rights</u>
 <u>law</u>
- Mandates equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities
- Signed into law July 26, 1990

Title IV: Telecommunications



Equality in Access

The primary responsibility of public agencies with regard to the ADA is to provide equal access to PROGRAMS, SERVICES, & ACTIVITIES



Title II Basic Requirements

- 1. Designate ADA Coordinator
- 2. ADA Grievance Procedure
- 3. ADA Notice
- 4. Self-Evaluation
- 5. Develop a Transition Plan
 - Required to be drafted and approved by July 26, 1992
 - Required to be completed by January 26, 1995



Services in Existing Facilities

Options:

1. Make alterations to the facility

2. Provide the same City service in another accessible location


Provide auxiliary aides or services to assist the individual


ADA Facilities Assessment Goals

- Identify physical barriers in public areas
- Document existing conditions in 18 facilities
- Described the barrier removal solutions
- Establish priorities and action plans
- Established planning level cost estimates

Prioritization of ADA Improvements

- Established criteria for prioritization
- Conducted interviews with City staff to assign priorities
- Reviewed priorities with the DAC and the community



Prioritization of Barriers City-wide

- 1. Level of use by the public
- 2. Social need
- 3. Citizen Rights
- 4. Program uniqueness
- 5. Geographic distribution
- 6. Critical nature of the service provided



Prioritization of Barriers within Facilities

- Building entrance and primary path of travel
- 2. Barrier removal items that improve access to program use areas
- 3. Amenities
- 4. Areas and elements not required to be modified


