



#### Background:



- These Fresno County leaders formed a Steering Committee, and have met monthly since February 2015.



## PRETERM BIRTH RATES (FRESNO VS. CALIFORNIA)






## Fresno County Preterm Birth Rate Babies are born full term after 37weeks




### CA vs. Fresno County 2006-2013 Infant Mortality Rate:
