We'd like to extend our sincere appreciation for your continued analysis to determine the appropriate Water Development Impact Fees. It has certainly been an arduous process and we are thankful it is near completion.

From the beginning, we whole-heartedly expressed our support for a justified fee increase if and when the appropriate reviews and cost analysis were completed. After several discussions with City staff in regards to the North East Fresno Surface Water Treatment Plant (NEFSWTP), it is clearly evident that the expansion of the facility, and the construction of the associated transmission and plumbing system, have not been properly evaluated under CEQA, nor have the associated costs been justified with cost estimates from experienced contractor(s).

Therefore, taking into consideration the postponement of the fee increase item until the March 23, 2017 Council hearing, we'd like to take the opportunity to propose the following recommendations before the City Council is asked to vote on the fees:

- 1. City staff should determine, through proper analysis, if a water plant expansion is necessary and required for projected new growth. In addition, staff should identify with specificity the timeframe in which the plant will be needed;
- 2. If the analysis confirms the need for expansion, then the city should complete a proper CEQA analysis, and determine the exact scope of work for the plant's expansion and related transmission infrastructure improvements;
- 3. City staff should develop a detailed scope of work, provide such to contractors for bids/estimates, and thereafter determine estimated costs with credible amounts;
- 4. City staff should develop a mechanism or program guidelines that clearly establishes how developers will be reimbursed for these infrastructure costs;
- 5. City staff should consult with the development community to review the analysis and proposed fee increases before the new fee structure is introduced to the City Council.

Until the required analysis has been completed and a system is in place that details the application of fee credits to the development community for public infrastructure costs borne by new home buyers we propose that the Council restrict its action to the adoption of a fee increase that excludes the NEFSWTP and associated infrastructure costs.

Please let us know if there is anything we can do to assist in addressing these important issues.
