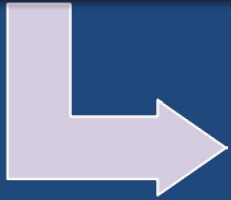

WCAG 2.0 Principles

Perceivable

- Available to the senses
- Easy to see or hear

Operable

- Interface, controls
- Usable with mouse & keyboard

POUR

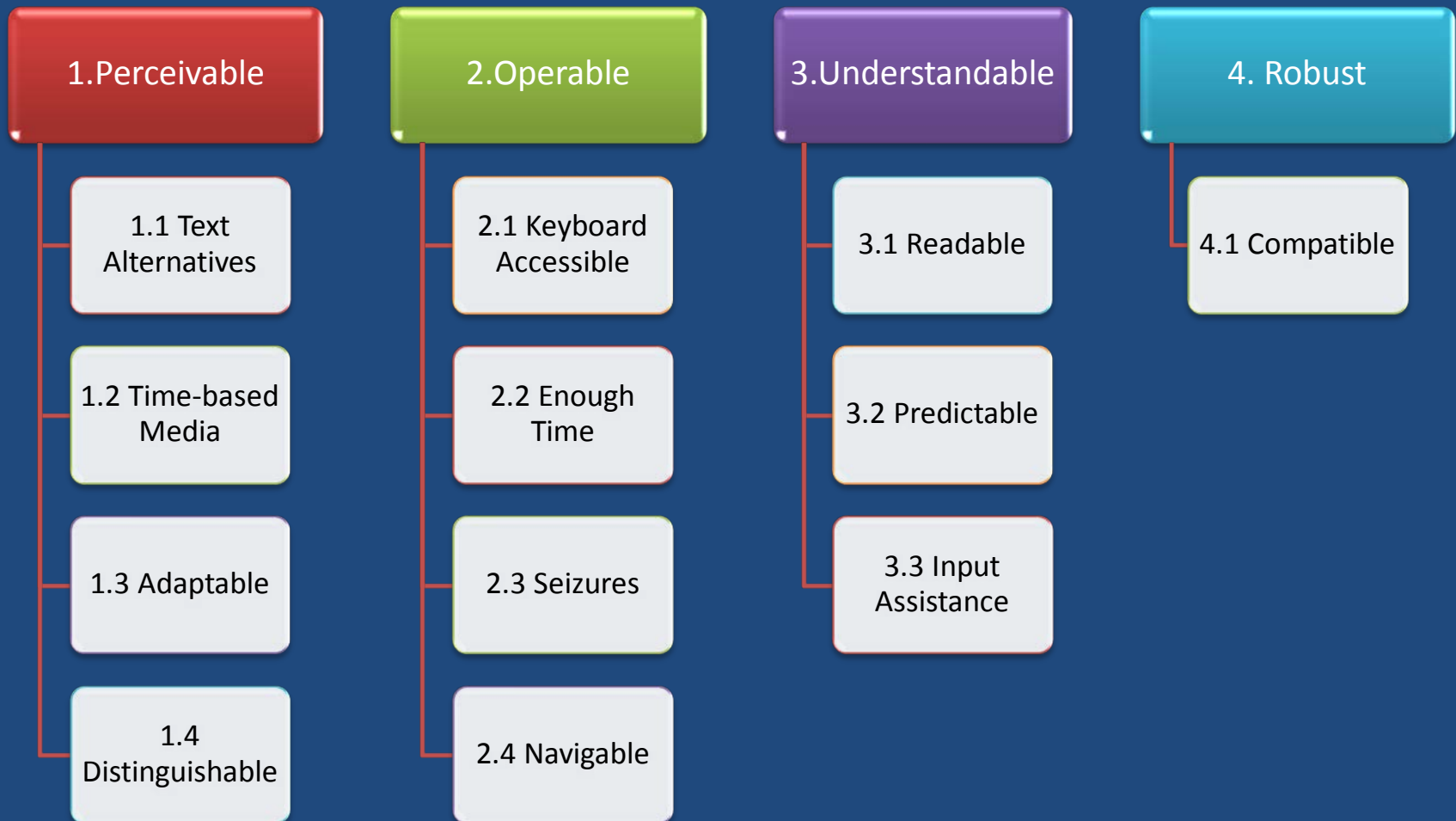
Understandable

- Easy to read
- Well-organized

Robust

- Used reliably by variety of browsers, OS, and Assistive Technology

WCAG 2.0 Guidelines



WCAG 2.0 Success Criteria

Specific, testable criteria for judging conformance

- A - Priority 1 checkpoints (*Must*)
- AA - Priority 1 and 2 checkpoints (*Should*)
- AAA - Priority 1, 2, and 3 checkpoints (*May*)

Trend: settlements require Level AA minimum

City Action Steps - Procurements

1. Policy on accessible ICT (1-2 yrs)
 - Vendor services
 - Website accessibility
2. Notifying existing contractors about expectations for compliance (1-2 yrs)
3. Testing before contract renewal (3-5 yrs)
4. Renewed vendor contracts include accessibility conformance requirements (3-5 yrs)

City Action Steps - Website

1. Accessibility issues in the updated website that are identified will be remediated (1 yr)
2. Weekly automated testing (ongoing)
3. Annual testing by individuals with a variety of disabilities (ongoing)

City Action Step – Web Accessibility Coordinator

1. The City will designate a Web Accessibility Coordinator responsible for coordinating the City's web accessibility compliance.
 - The Web Accessibility Coordinator shall be knowledgeable concerning the WCAG 2.0 and web accessibility generally and is available as a resource for Web Content Personnel

City Action Steps - Training

1. ISD Staff to be trained on WCAG 2.0 requirements and how to test for accessibility.
2. Annual training for webmaster and Web Accessibility Coordinator
3. City Staff members who prepare PDFs for posting on the City's website will receive training in creating accessible PDF files.
