Each bidder has agreed to allow the City sixty-four (64) days from date bids are opened to accept or reject their bid proposal. Purchasing requests that you complete the following sections and return this bid evaluation to the Purchasing Division at the latest by Monday, April 17, 2017, 5:00 P.M.

The Engineer's Estimate for this expenditure is \$795,000. The contract price is 18.66% above the Engineer's Estimate.

During the bidding phase, coating repair work on a similar digester presented issues with the specified coatings. As a result of those issues, the coating was changed to one that would avoid similar issues. The different coating compensates for concrete wall movement caused my thermal expansion. The specific change was from a rigid epoxy to a polyurethane elastomeric coating. This change caused the price for interior coating to increase.

<u>BACKGROUND OF PROJECT</u> (To be completed by Evaluating Department/Division. Explain need for project/equipment):

The first phase of the project requires the cleaning and dewatering of Digesters #1 and #13.

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The digesters are of two of thirteen mesophilic anaerobic digesters used in the treatment of the solids generated at the RWRF to eliminate the pathogens and volatile organic compounds. Over a period of eight years, these digesters accumulate debris associated with the treatment (i.e. solids consisting of sludge, sand, plastics and hair). This project will remove all the accumulated debris, allow inspection of the interior surfaces for corrosion, wear, and structural stability, and it will prepare Digester #1 for rehabilitation.

The second phase of the project is the rehabilitation of Digester #1. During routine maintenance on the roof of the digester, it was discovered that methane gasses were escaping through cracks in the roof of the digester. Leaking methane to the atmosphere is against the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control Districts (SJVAPCD) rules. Methane is highly flammable, and leaking methane is a potential fire/explosion hazard. The work of this project includes the removal and replacement of the failing interior coatings. The project also includes application of a ferric corrosion eliminator and a new roof coating.
