RESTORE FRESNO COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION

- GOAL: To see revitalization take place in key commercial corridors (Blackstone, Tower District, Kings Canyon, Belmont, Chinatown, Tulare)
- **PROCESS**: Build an approach similar to the Neighborhood Revitalization Team including code, capacity, etc.
- CASESTUDY: Fulton Corridor
 - Incentive package
 - Code sweeps
 - Education process
 - Capacity building (merchants association, PBIDs)
