
YLI has served 89,000 youth in 220 communities, and worked on the passage of over 200 policies in its 27 year history.

In Summer of 2018 YLI launched programs in Madera County and as of October 1, 2018, YLI will have offices in Coachella and Long Beach








The kNOw Youth Media


Fresno Youth Commission
