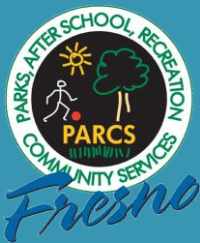


PARK MASTER PLAN – WHAT IS IT?

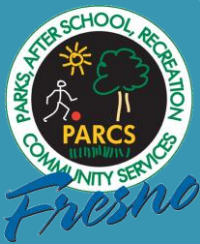
- Comprehensive Document Related to Parks, Programming, and Development
 - ✓ Identifies Current/Existing Conditions
amenities, life cycle, maintenance levels, and associated costs
 - ✓ Sets the Vision – typically 20 years
 - ✓ Establishes Policies
 - ✓ Sets Standards
 - ✓ Provides Guidance on How, When, Where, and How Much

PARK MASTER PLAN PROCESS - SIMPLIFIED



ANALYSIS: LIFECYCLE REPLACEMENT COSTS

PROS and Precision Engineering have evaluated Fresno's park system and assessed the asset value of the system at \$266,360,720.

Within the next 10 years, the capital improvement funding needed for lifecycle replacement is \$112,748,025.

- This number does not include Operations and Maintenance costs.

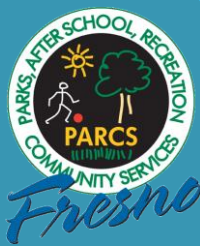


The average access score (including sidewalks, transit, etc.)

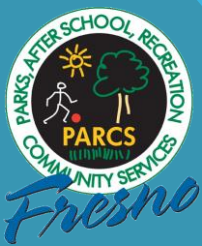
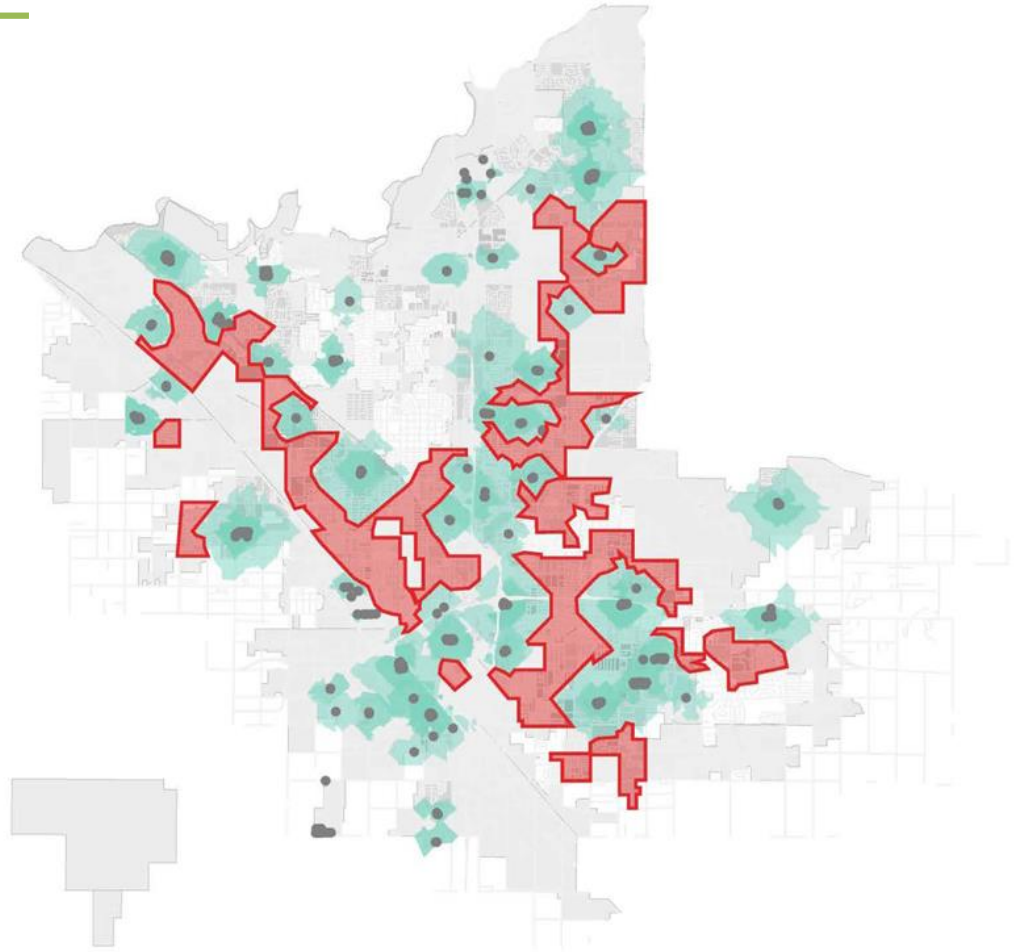

Bucket 1:

Annual Maintenance Cost for Fresno’s 1,100 Acres



\$7,700,000 – \$11,000,000

(Northern CA standard maintenance spending averages 7K - \$10K per acre)

\$2,750,000

(City of Fresno spends \$2.5K per acre on maintenance)

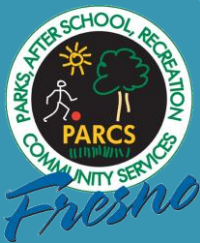

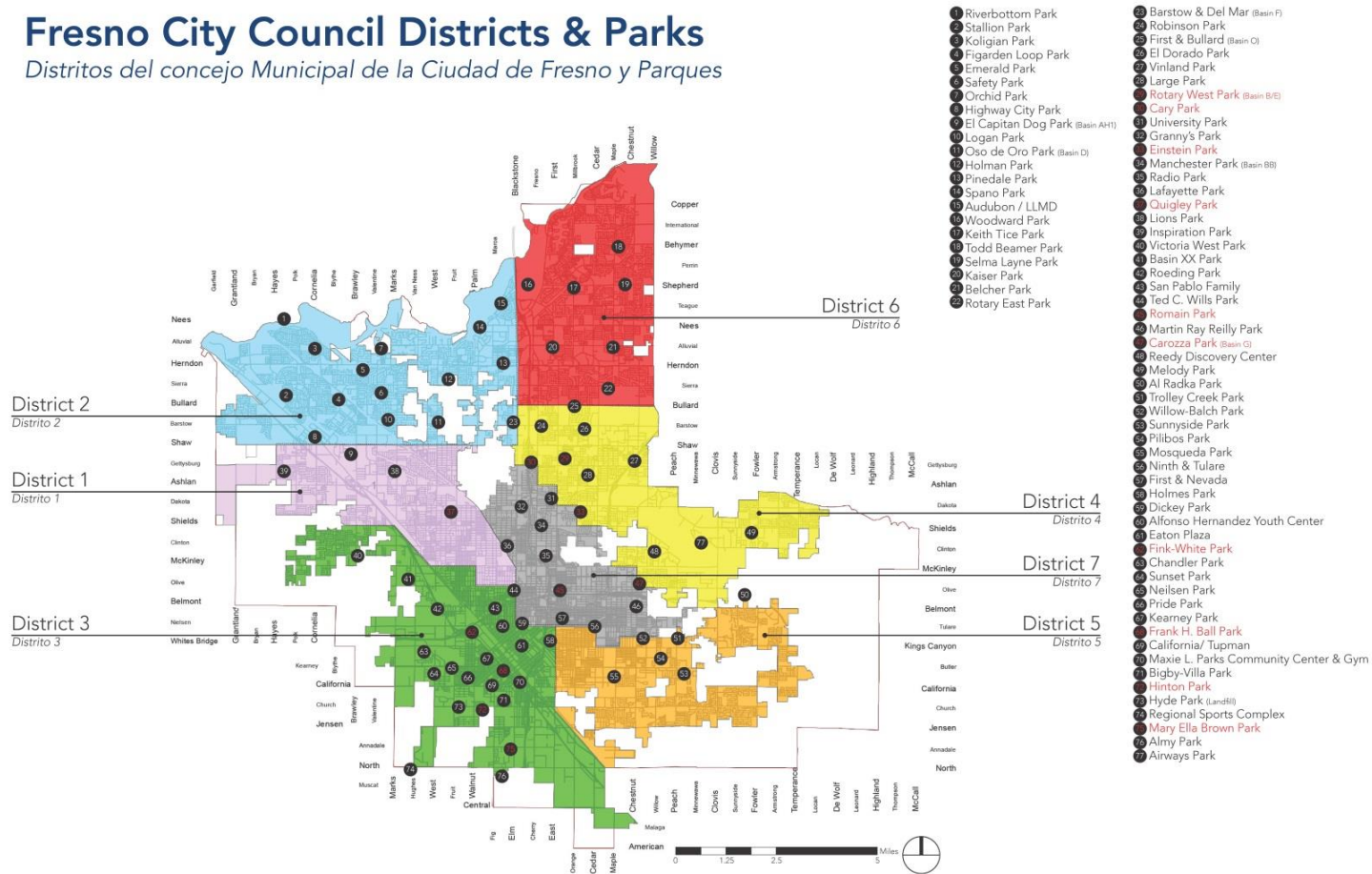

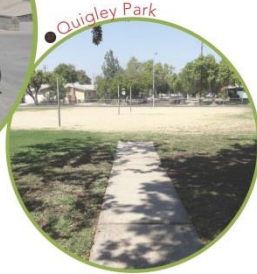
